AMSTERDAM, April 16 .- That a main portion of the American position orth of St. Mihlel on the right bank of the Muese River and south and coat of Maisey was taken by storm on Friday night is indicated in a dispatch from the Wolff bureau of Berlin, dated Monday. The dispatch declares that a large section of the main line of defense on the main road from Rouvrois to St. Mihlel for a distance of three and a half miles was rolled back despite the resistance of the Americans. The enemy suffered heavy casualties and loss of prisoners.
