WATER USERS LOSE POWER SITES HERE

REPORT FROM SOME WHO HAVE STUDIED MATTER IS THAT UNDER NEW CONTRACT THE GOVERNMENT RETAINS POWER SITES

The vote of the Klamath Water Users Association under the reclamation service here adopting the new offer of organization made by the government, has been approved by a very large majority, seventy-four to four being the number announced by the judges when the final returns were in last night.

Under the new system there are apparently many advantages, which will devolve upon the water users heretofore denied them, and which were probably responsible for the heavy favorable vote.

A report is now current, however, coming from some who have given the matter considerable attention, that the contract now assumed, does not include the power sites, which have been previously held by the Water Users Association, but that these are now retained by the government.

Whether this matter was brought up to the voters of the district by those who canvassed the territory in favor of the new system is not known, but it would appear that the loss to the water users of the project is substantial.

A considerable controversy arose here last year when the United States reclamation service authorized a contract with the California-Oregon Power company to construct a power plant and dam at the head of Link River, with power privileges for fifty years, and the exclusive right to the use of the Keno canal for a period of ten years.

The directors of the Water Users Association passed a resolution empowering the association to retain attorneys and enjoy the power company from this procedure, which was deemed against the best interests of the members. The directors' acts were later approved by a vote of the stock holders of the association, but under the new system, it is believed that the power site question will be a matter out of the hands of the water users.

MUCH NEEDED LEGISLATION IS STARTED

OREGON SENATOR INTRODUCES MEASURE WHICH WILL TEND TO STABILIZE PRICES OF WHEAT SUBSTITUTES

A bill which will provide the president of the United States to extend the fixing of prices during the period of the war, not only to wheat, but to petroleum, skins and hides, hemp, jute, cotton and wool, farm implements, wheat substitutes such as corn, rye, barley, oats, and livestock and its products, wherever sold, has just been introduced into the senate by Senator Chas. H. McNary, who declares that he will get the matter up for consideration of the legislators at the earliest possible moment, in the belief that the country will benefit by its enactment.

It has been felt for some time locally that the present regulations would not work out for the best interests of all, and that by making a fixed price for wheat and allowing private interests to fix and control prices of substitutes the wheat substitutes will soon soar to a figure beyond the reach of the ordinary purse. It would seem that if the government finds it necessary to assume charge of one commodity, it would be not only wise, but necessary to take over the others in the same class. It is hoped by many here that Senator McNary's measure will be enacted at an early date.

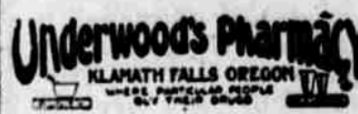
