Helped Boy Scouts Boost Liberty Loan

The Boy Scouts of America, under the leadership of James E. West, Chief Scout executive, who made a great drive as "moppers up" in the Liberty Loan campaign. They were ambitious to exceed their record of \$102,054,100 sale of bonds in the Second Liberty loan. In the First Liberty loan campaign they sold \$23,238,250 worth of bonds. The boys made this drive by special request of Secretary of the Treasury McAdoo. Chief Scout Executive West is adding 1,200 Boy Scouts a day to his membership, which on April 20th was 332,116.

AUSTRIANS NOW HAVE AERIAL POSTAL SERVICE

AMSTERDAM, April 18.—(By mail). A regular aerial postal service between Vienna and Lemberg, established by the military authorities, began on March 31st. The post carries mainly official dispatches, but may be used for private letters if the latter are franked with a special stamp, for which the price is about four times the ordinary rate.

The flight from Vienna to Lemberg takes about seven hours, as against 17 hours by express train.

On March 23, an aerial postman left Vienna at 6:45 a. m. and arrived at Cracow at 10 a. m.

HUNS SHOOT 800,000 SHELLS PER HOUR

DERNE, April 21.—(Correspondence of the Associated Press)—German batteries before the great assault on the British front on March 21st fired almost three times as many shells in three hours as the Germans fired in the entire Franco-Prussian war.

A German staff officer has informed a Swiss newspaper that the German artillery used more than 1,500,000 shells during the three hours' bombardment preceding the attacks. This is over 3,300 a minute, or estimated on a front of fifty miles, about 160 per minute per mile.

The total number of shells used by Germany in the war of 1870 was about 650,000.

Many Huns Now Favor Wilson's Peace Terms

STOCKHOLM, May 14.—The Copenhagen correspondent of the Politiken quotes Austro-German travelers arriving in Denmark as picturing the situation in both Teutonic empires as gloomy. Their observations, summarized, are:

"Germany fears America, as Napoleon feared Russia. Victory must come quickly, else Germany will go under. Depression is great throughout Austro-Hungary, where peace is sorely needed. The Czechs are determined to establish a republic, as are the Slavs and Poles."

"The cry, 'Long Live Wilson!' is frequently heard."

"The situation in Hungary is confused. Count Tisza rules from behind the scenes. Food is sufficient, but Austria is boycotted, and nothing is obtainable from Ukraine. Vienna workers have advised Austrian prisoners to remain in Russia."

"If Germany is unable to win on the western front, the reichstag will make a peace offer corresponding to the fourteen articles laid down by President Wilson."
