Expenditures of The Red Cross Outlined

How did the Red Cross spend your money?

The story of where your dollar went and the dollars of the millions of Americans who helped to make up the last \$100,000,000 fund of the American Red Cross is told by a glance at the map herewith.

This map explains very vividly just why the American Red Cross is asking the nation for \$100,000,000 next week.

It shows where every dollar was spent in Europe.

It gives the answer as to why Oregon is being asked by the Red Cross for \$600,000.

The total of the Red Cross war fund receipts, including interest, amounted to \$110,184,360.47; the total appropriations have amounted to \$83,217,943.82; while chapters received in refunds for their military work \$17,401,048.04. On April 15th there was available for distribution \$10,515,347.61, and this will practically all have been expended before June 1st.

President Wilson appointed the present war council on May 10th of

last year. The synopsis of the principal expenditures shows the following: France, \$30,926,103.04; Belgium, \$2,086,131.00; Italy, \$4,588,353.00; Russia, \$1,243,845.00; Roumania, \$2,578,368.76; Serbia, \$884,580.76; Great Britain, \$3,360,330.75; Relief work, other foreign countries, \$4,476,300.00.

Relief work, American prisoners in Germany, \$361,064.00.

Equipment and expense of Red Cross work sent abroad, \$301,300.00.

Relief work, United States, \$8,723,123.27.

Working capital, purchase of supplies for resale to chapters or for shipment abroad, \$15,000,000.00.

Working cash advances for France and United States, \$4,588,353.00.

Grasshoppers And Cutworms Busy Here

Many farmers are reporting considerable damage done by grasshoppers in different sections of Klamath County this season. Where the grasshoppers are beginning to show up in any considerable amount, farmers should take some means of destroying them as early as possible. The following formula has been used in Klamath County in practically every section where grasshoppers have been a menace during the last four years, and is highly recommended by this office:

Fifty pounds bran.
Two pounds paris green.
One pound salt.
One ounce lemon extract.

In some cases, one quart of some cheap kerosene might be added, but its necessity in the above formula is doubtful. The paris green and salt should be thoroughly mixed with the dry bran in the above, after which enough water is added to make a mash sufficiently wet that water will not quite run. The lemon extract may then be added, this being simply for the purpose of attracting the insects, its odor having proven the best of all substances used for the purpose.

The above mixture should be scat-

tered broadcast over infested fields and pastures in the early morning while the dew is yet on and before the insects have begun to feed. The efficiency of the bait is much lessened after drying out, although there is a possibility of the dew rendering the dried-out mixture again useful. For the above reasons, early morning scattering is imperative. The amount of mixture given in the formula above should be sufficient for ten acres, where properly scattered. In all ordinary cases one application will be sufficient; but in extreme infection, two, or even more, may be necessary.

The poison alone is not in itself sufficient, but should be coupled with preventive measures. The insects breed in dry, unfertilized soil, and proper discing and plowing in the fall and early spring will destroy the egg masses before hatching. Covering of all in the affected area is absolutely necessary, as land not at first in the affected area may be later endangered thru the migration of the hoppers.

This same formula can be used for cut worms, by scattering about the fields infested.—H. Roland Olney, County Agricultural Agent.

way, New York City. At the head of the new division is Captain Kenneth D. Hequembourg, U. S. R., an active wheat producer of Oklahoma, who has had first hand threshing experience.

The division has already arranged, as a part of its organization, to have county threshing committees carry the educational and mechanical activities planned to every threshing machine owner and operating crew in the United States. A typical county threshing committee will consist of the county food administrator, the county agricultural agent and a retired thresherman representing the state or local council of defense.

Each committee will maintain open headquarters and devote attention to threshing operations within the county, endeavoring thru mechanical assistance and emphasis on methods of conservation to secure a high quality of work.

Will Thresh Cleaner and Save Much Wheat

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 17.—Plans to save wheat and other small grains at their source by cleaner threshing are announced as a new activity of the United States food administration. Best estimates show a preventable loss of more than three bushels of grain in every 100 bushels threshed. This amount, it is believed, can be saved for human consumption by more careful methods and better mechanical condition of threshing out-

fits. In cases of conspicuously poor threshing nearly 10 per cent of the grain has, in the past, gone into the straw stack. Last fall many farmers in the Central West re-threshed old wheat stacks and recovered large quantities of marketable grain.

Effectively to conduct this season's drive for more careful and cleaner threshing, a special grain threshing division has been established under the food administration grain corporation, with general offices at 45 Broad-

Notice Inviting Bids for Installing Sewer Main

Bids will be received by the Common Council up to and including the 20th day of May, at 5 o'clock p. m., for installing a six-inch sewer main in Fairview Addition "one" and "two," between the points named as follows:

Beginning at the intersection (center of intersection) of Delta street and the alley separating Fairview Addition No. 1 from Fairview Addition No. 2, running thence south thru the center of said alley to Upham street; thence to a connection with the manhole at the center of the intersection of Upham and Prospect streets; beginning again at center of intersection of said alley and Fulton street, and running thence west on Fulton street to the west boundary line of Oregon avenue, terminating in a manhole to be installed at said last mentioned point.

The main is to be installed under the direction and supervision of the city engineer, and will include the placing of Y's and manholes and lamp-holes as he may direct and order.

The city will furnish 600 feet of six-inch vitrified sewer pipe. The successful bidder to furnish balance of pipe required. The total length of main to be installed being 1,270 feet.

The installation to be completed within thirty days from the date of entering into bond and contract for its installation.

A bond of \$500 will be required from the successful bidder.

All bids must be accompanied by a certified check to the amount of 10 per cent of bid, to be forfeited by successful bidder in the event of failure to enter into contract and bond with the city council within five days after award.
