

Big Battle Described By London Officer

LONDON, May 30.—In a letter received this week, a lieutenant in a London regiment says, according to the Daily News:

"To give you some idea of our last seven days, we were gassed and shelled and attacked every night and morning. Altho we suffered casualties, I am proud to say we never gave an inch, and the casualties we inflicted

on the enemy were enormous. In parts of our front they lie eight and nine deep of wounded and dead. I've seen more fighting during the last month than during the rest of my previous fifteen months of actual experience in the lines put together. One day we finished up with our flares, and, as you may guess, in that art we had Fritz beaten to a frazzle. We are now enjoying a few days' rest."

HUNS USE PERSUASIVE LOGIC FOR LOAN BONDS

AMSTERDAM, May 30.—One of the official war loan advertisements now appearing in the German newspapers gives an unintended glimpse of the German rule in occupied countries. It says:

"How can any German still hesitate

to subscribe for the war loan? You who are faint-hearted, go and ask the Belgians, the Serbians, the Russians, the Italians, what it means to have the enemy in the country. Do you not realize that it is your support of the loan only that can keep the horrors of an enemy occupation from Germany's soil?"

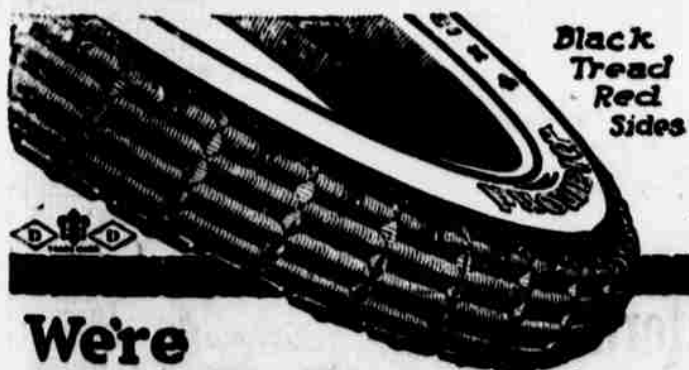

RUSS AWARE OF DANGER FROM HUNS

PRESS ADMITS DANGER OF GERMAN MILITARISM, BUT WOULD STEER CLEAR OF ALLIED AID AND AVOID RE-ENTERING WAR

MOSCOW, May 30.—The bolshevik newspapers declare that the Russians are fully aware of the dangers now threatening the Russian people from German imperialism.

They declare, however, that no allied help is wanted in this matter, as it would result in Russia's re-entering the war. Economic help is urged.

Frank Staff has bought a couple of lots in Shippington, and will soon commence the construction of a residence. The wind storm on the Upper Lake Tuesday was very severe, according to the boatmen who were on the water at the time. The tug Ranger, under Captain Wickstrom, is declared to have had a hard time attempting to face the gale, but came thru in good shape. The steamer Klamath is also reported to have had a hard time rounding Eagle Point.

Until further notice all dances given at St. Cloud will be conducted in the interest of the Red Cross. The floor space is being enlarged, and will be able to accommodate 100 dancers.

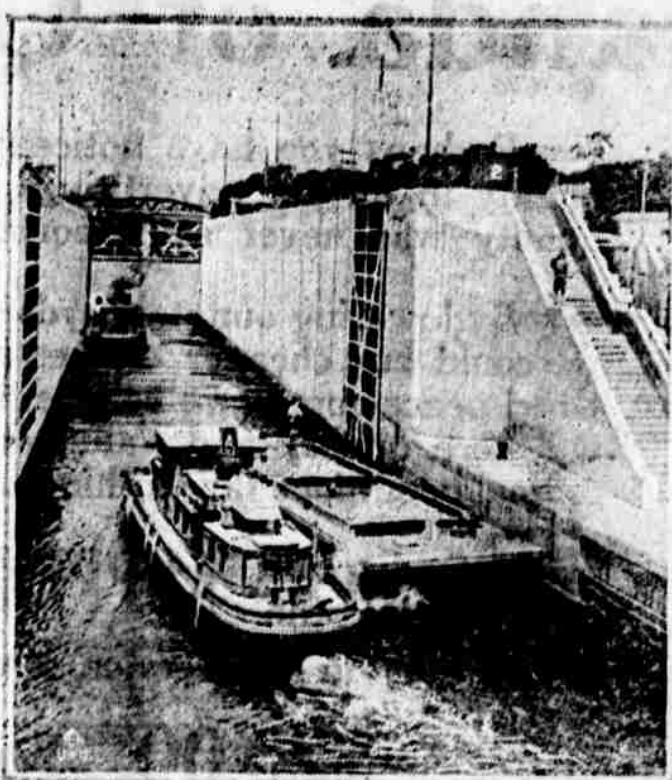

Greatest American Canal Is Opened



New York state's barge canal, connecting the Great Lakes with the Atlantic Ocean at a cost of \$150,000,000, has been opened, and this photograph shows the eastern terminal at Watford, N. Y. Barges and their tugs are entering the great locks to be lifted

up on their way to Buffalo. The whole canal system with its tributaries is 452 miles long. Very large barges can now make the trip from the Great Lakes to New York City harbor. It is the greatest canal built on the American continent with the exception of the Panama canal.

Testament Saves Life of Soldier

WITH THE AMERICAN ARMY IN FRANCE, May 30.—The Bible as an instrument for saving soldiers' lives has always been a favorite theme in poetry and fiction. In the case of William Wilson of New Castle, Pa., there is more truth than poetry as regards his narrow escape from death, thanks to his pocket Bible.

Wilson is 19 years of age and a member of an infantry unit in the sector held by Americans in Picardy. A German sniper shot Wilson in the left chest. The steel jacketed bullet was prevented from reaching his heart or lung by a pocket edition of a New Testament and a steel trench mirror. The bullet punctured the mirror, pinning the ragged edges of the metal in the cover of the Bible. It passed on

thru the book, defacing only part of Wilson's address written on the page, and causing scarcely more than a flesh wound in his chest.
