

# Airdales Found Most Valuable In Army

CHICAGO, May 31.—The Airdale, a shaggy, sad-eyed dog that gained popularity only in recent years, has convinced officers of the Central Department Signal Corps, United States Army, of its superiority over all breeds as a canine war messenger.

While official authorization for use of the Airdale on the battlefields of Europe has not yet been issued by war department, schools for intensive training have been established, and officers say that reports from the various army camps show that the dogs

have made remarkable progress. "The Airdale surpasses all other dogs in point of intelligence, and also peaceful, is also most courageous," said one officer. "Tests have established beyond doubt its superiority over other dogs as a war messenger, particularly those used by the German army."

"The Airdale is a cross from a bull terrier, otter hound and a Berkeley terrier. It is a result of years of careful breeding, and its name, it is said, is derived from the Aire Valley of England, where it originated."
