YAINAX, June 1.—A very enjoyable time occurred at the home of Peter Schonchin at Sprague River on the Klamath Reservation upon the visit of his oldest son, Cain Schonchin, private, Battery A, 78th Field Artillery, stationed at Camp Doniphan, Fort Sill, Oklahoma. Mr. Schonchin volunteered his services in the army a few weeks after war was declared on the autocratic and imperial government of Germany. He is the grandson of Chief Schonchin, who took an important part in the war at the Lava Beds in 1874 between Captain Jack's band of Modocs and the United States troops. The battery of which Mr. Schonchin is a member is soon to be transferred to France.

Quite a gathering of the neighbors and friends were in evidence, and various games and dances were indulged in by those present. Following a sumptuous supper, served by the home folks, the guests departed wishing the guest of honor a safe return, with the scalp of the Kaiser hanging from his belt.
