Greatest "Con Man" Is Dead

"Jim" Jordan, whose "moniker" or real name was Harry Gilmore, perhaps the greatest confidence man in his own line which the country has produced, died in Johns Hopkins hospital, Baltimore, aged 75 years, the other day. He had stolen a million dollars. His operations extended from Berlin to Portland, Ore., in his best days. He was also a gun man of prowess among his kind. He killed a Chicago hack driver later "because he did not drive fast enough," and served three years for that. In 1892 he killed Cliff Sparks in Denver, and was acquitted. He was a partner of "Turkey Legs" Wilson, and of "Sleepy Jake," otherwise Jake Rose, at various times. He had served many terms in prison.

Just as the Titanic was starting on her fatal trip across the Atlantic from Liverpool, Jordan went on board with "Doc" Owens and two others. A steward "made" him, and he decided he would not be able to swindle passengers, so he got off with one of the party. Owens and a fourth man remained on board, but were saved from the wreck, when the ship struck an ice berg.
