

Naval Recruiting Station Is Opened

For the convenience of the young men between the ages of 18 and 35, who are desirous of joining the U. S. Navy a Recruiting Office has been opened in this city, with headquarters in the Loomis Building on the second floor. This office will be in charge of the recruitment of the week, including Saturday, June 23d, after which time the officers in charge will return to Ashland.

The Navy is still open to registered men, providing they obtain a release from their Local Board. This also includes young men who registered on June 5, 1918.

All applicants accepted will be sent to Portland, Oregon, transportation free, for their final examination, and from there transferred to the training stations.

A number of attractive ratings are now open for enlistment, including electricians, machinists, carpenters, blacksmiths, cooperamiths, cooks, bakers, quartermasters, radio operators, hospital corp men, seamen and firemen. The aviation branch of the Navy is also open to enlistments.

A splendid motion picture reel has been obtained, displaying actual life in the Navy and will be shown every night for the remainder of the week at the Star Theatre. This reel is an official picture put out by the Navy Department.

MONTHLY PAY ROLL HERE IS NOW \$200,000

CITY BANKER DECLARES ABOVE FIGURES VERY CONSERVATIVE FOR MILLS AND FACTORIES OF KLAMATH COUNTY

That the mills and box factories now in operation in Klamath county have a monthly pay roll in excess of \$200,000 is affirmed by Cashier Leslie Rogers of the First National Bank who has given some time to looking this matter up and who declares that the figure named is a very conservative one.

The following is the list, some exact and some approximate, of the larger operations here. Pelican Bay Lumber company, Klamath Falls, \$69,000; Algoma Lumber company, Algoma, \$43,000; Klamath Manufacturing company, Klamath Falls, \$33,000; Modoc Lumber company, Chilcote, \$18,000; Lamm Lumber company, Modoc Point, \$13,000; Ewauna Box company, Klamath Falls, \$13,000; Big Lakes Box company, Klamath Falls, \$7,000; Chelsea Box company, Klamath Falls, \$6,000; Ackley Brothers, Klamath Falls, \$4,500.

In addition to these there are a number of smaller mills and lumber camps over the county which would swell this total very substantially.

A pay roll of this magnitude, one of the largest in the state of Oregon, outside of Portland, means everything to a growing community, and should be appreciated by all business men merchants and those who have material investments here, it is declared.
