ANGLER LANDS BIG FISH ON LITTLE HOOK

EXPERT FISHERMAN FROM CALIFORNIA MAKES UNUSUAL CATCH IN KLAMATH STREAM—HIS NINTH TRIP HERE

A ten and a quarter pound rainbow trout on a number 14 fly is the remarkable catch made by Fred K. Burnham at Spring Creek on the Klamath Reservation recently.

The fish was landed in 25 minutes from the time he was hooked. While this is by no means the largest trout hooked in these waters, it is the largest fish secured on so small a hook. Mr. Burnham, who is a celebrated angler from Martinez, Cal., has fished all the notable streams in the country and declares that Spring Creek affords the best fly fishing of any, from a sportsman's point of view. "You see the fish and the fish sees you, and it's a fair game," he declares.

This is the ninth season that he has visited Klamath county. Burnham has all his tackle specially made to order. On leaving here he will go to the Upper Rogue river to fish for steel head.

COUNTY AGENT SAYS HOPPERS ARE SERIOUS

Farmers of the county are urged to give special attention to the eradication of grass hoppers by County Agriculturist H. R. Glaser, who declares that this pest is becoming a serious menace to the county in the districts of Langell Valley, Keno and Merrill. A number of valuable recipes for poison are on file at his office, which may be had by anyone on application. One recipe which is especially recommended is as follows: 50 pounds of bran, 2 pounds of Paris green, 1 pound of salt, 1 ounce of lemon extract.

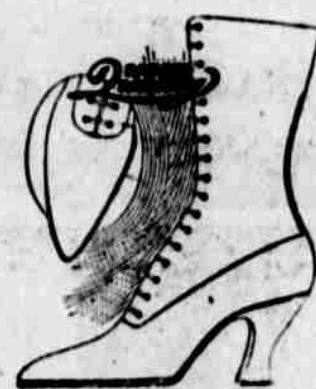
