\$100,000 Relief Cargo To Be Shipped Abroad

Los Angeles, Cal., June 27.—War's influence upon benevolence has resulted in the strictest secrecy as to the date for shipping to France a relief cargo of various composition and valued at more than \$100,000. While before the entrance of the United States into the war, the charitable donations of Californians to the sufferers of France and Belgium were known to the world and the departure and route of vessels bearing them to Europe were data free to all, fear of the activities of German spies had brought about a condition in which secrecy forms a prominent part. The vessels which will be utilized in bearing the cargo to France and the date upon which it will sail, not to mention the route to be taken, are matters for the determination of the United States shipping board and officials here declare that members of that body will not make public announcements as to their plans. The cargo is a gift of the people of Southern California, fully 100,000 men, women and children joining in making the contributions, while 150 chambers of commerce, boards of trade, churches and social, civic and fraternal organizations have also had their share in its collection. LAUNDRY DELIVERY SERVICE CHANGES NEXT MONDAY

For all family bundle work, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of each week will constitute regular pick-up days, and Thursday, Friday and Saturday will constitute regular delivery days for the bundles picked up Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Bundles picked up before noon Monday will be delivered Thursday, those received before noon Tuesday will be delivered Friday, and those received up to Wednesday night will be delivered Saturday, except the rough-dry bundles received up to Monday night, which will be delivered Thursday.

We shall be glad to pick up bundles at our convenience on the regular delivery days, but such bundles will not be delivered until the following pick-up day, either Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday, as the case may be.

Any service, other than the above, required of us, we shall be glad to render when possible, but it will be considered a special service and subject to an additional charge of 25 per cent of the total charges.
