GERMANS ADOPT HARSH MEASURES WITH BOLSHEVIKI

New York, July 10.—German courts martial evidently administer the law with a stern hand in the attempt to prevent the spread in Germany of Bolsheviki doctrines. Their application of the law was denounced in the reichstag by the Socialist, Dr. Cohn, as a disgrace to German justice, according to the Cologne Gazette.

Citing instances to show how severe these sentences had been, Dr. Cohn said that a woman who stooped to pick up her hat which had fallen on the ground near a trolley car was sentenced to serve one and one-half years in a penitentiary on a charge of attempting to endanger transportation. Dr. Cohn said he could enumerate dozens of similar cases.

WEST POINT ANNAPOLIS EXAMINATIONS IN OCTOBER

Congressman Nick Sinnott will hold a competitive examination, open to every eligible boy in the Second Oregon district, for the West Point Military and Annapolis Naval Academy on October 19, 1918. The examinations, which will be given for the congressman by the United States civil service commission, will be held simultaneously in the following eight counties: Klamath Falls, Lakeview, Ontario Bend, Baker, LaGrande, Pendleton, The Dalles.

Those candidates standing highest in each examination will be appointed as principals and alternates in order of standing to fill the one vacancy in West Point and one in Annapolis. Such successful candidates will take the official examinations in the spring of 1919 and if successful; same will enter the academies in June.

Candidates to be eligible must be bona fide residents of the Second district of Oregon, and if trying for the West Point cadetship must be between 17 and 22 years of age on the date of admission; and if for appointment as midshipman at Annapolis between the ages of 16 and 20 at date of official examination.

Those interested should write at once to Hon. N. J. Sinnott, Room 242 House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., stating whether they prefer the naval or military academy and requesting a copy of booklet giving full information and sample questions.
