

New Hun Generals On Western Front

Amsterdam, July 10.—The Cologne Unsette published a brief biographical notice about a number of German generals who have been named recently for the first time as having command of armies on the western front.

General von Larisch now fighting against the French, had been retired before the war, but is now again in active service.

General Wichura fought in 1915 on the west front in a minor command and was also mentioned once last April in connection with an attack on the Ome-Adme canal.

General von Winkler, 63 years old, was a divisional commander of the Prussian guard before the war.

General Hae before the war was in command of a brigade of garrison artillery at Cologne. Later he was chief of staff of the Fourth army.
