

Clothing Is Scarce Article In Berlin

The Hague, July 22.—Leather shoes are sold out in Berlin, says the correspondent of the Amsterdam Handelsblad.

"Clothing of all kinds, including underclothing, is most difficult to get, even with a clothing card. No handkerchiefs, shirts, no socks, no napkins, no woolen or cotton jackets for baby. Decent washing and toilet soap has long been unobtainable. Many, many things are unobtainable that are still to be had in Holland, although prices may run much higher than in peace times. Yet the Berliners look fairly clean and well-groomed. The art of clothes mending has

been carried to a fine point here. And water and sand keeps you clean too, at a pinch.

"A smokable cigar cannot be had for less than 60 fennigs, and then not more than three at a time. A cigarette costs 12 fennigs, and smoking tobacco has gone the way of rice and beans and peas and salad oil and brandy and turpentine and sealing wax and a hundred other articles. Gone, completely gone.

"Only as regards fuel, the Berliners are better off. There is hardly any limit on gas, electricity or coal.

"Great material privations have

been, and are being borne, with fortitude. Added to which are the pangs of mourning for sorrow, grief and anxiety in thousands of homes for the fallen, and those about to fall."

FIVE STUDENT NURSES ASKED FROM KLAMATH

WOMAN'S COMMITTEE COUNCIL

The week of July 29 to August 11 has been set aside by the government for the enrollment of these young women. The number asked of Oregon is 10, and of Klamath county, five.

It is hoped that every young woman between the ages of 19 and 25, having high school training, good character, good health and good sense, will think most seriously of taking up this work.

Klamath county's young men have responded over willingly to the call of our country, and now the young women have a chance to show their patriotism.

WAYS OPEN FOR SPECIAL ARMY INSTRUCTION

MILITARY TRAINING NOW OFFERED AT BENSON POLYTECHNIC SCHOOL AT PORTLAND AND AT O. A. C.

Portland, July 22.—There are only two channels by which a young man registered under the selective draft can enter one of the special training courses conducted under the direction of the war department's committee on education and special training, of which Frank H. Shepherd, of Corvallis, is district educational director. These courses give special training such as now is being carried on in the Benson Polytechnic school in Portland and the O. A. C. at Corvallis.

Hundreds of requests are being received from young men of draft age for information as to how they may be inducted into these schools. This may be done either by individual induction or induction under call.

Local boards will be called upon to furnish men from time to time to be sent to these schools. This is induction under call. Director Shepherd points out. A man desiring special training who is qualified technically, educationally and physically, under the call may be inducted there under by his local board. Registrants should expect to keep in touch with their local boards in order to take advantage of such calls. Five or six days are allowed after the receipt of a call, so that those who desire to volunteer may do so. If this fails to fill the number specified, the board will draft men to complete the quota.

Under the individual induction plan, a registrant will communicate directly with the committee on education and special training, Room 595, state, war and navy building, Washington, D. C., stating his school, technical experience and the line of instruction preferred. Other in-

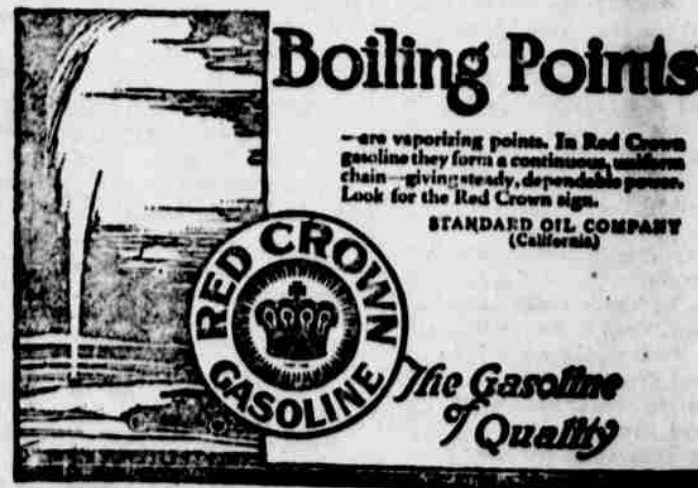
formation, regarding his draft status, physical classification, color, and address also must be supplied.

If the application in this case receives favorable consideration the applicant will be notified by his local board to appear and will be afforded opportunity to be voluntarily inducted. Registrants in Class IV on the ground of dependency must accompany their application with a waiver from the person in whose behalf the deferred classification was granted.
