

Soldier Writes Home Just Before His Death

The following letter was written by the late Carrol Gates to his parents at Hillsboro, Oregon, a few days after his being wounded in the front line trenches and just previous to his death in the hospital.

Young Gates was well known in Klamath Falls, where he lived as a little boy. He was one of the first to enlist at the outbreak of the war with Germany.

"Well, I'm in the hospital now and have all sorts of time for writing. I had bad luck at the front—was in the trenches only three days when Fritz got me. Those three days were full of thrills, tho, believe me—barages, gas, shrapnel. I soon got so I didn't care what happened.

"One afternoon I was helping carry a wounded man in when I was hit by machine gun bullet. I thought it was the finish for me at first. I thought of home and wondered if I

would ever see mother, father and Sis again. I was able to walk to the first aid station, where they patched me up. The bullet got me right in the left eye, so I won't be able to see quite so well as before. I am feeling fine and my eye doesn't hurt at all.

"This is a nice hospital, nice soft beds, real pillows—reminds me of home.

"The band is now giving a concert outside, and the music is so catchy I want to get up and dance. We feed pretty good here, but, oh, how I wish I could help you eat those strawberry shortcakes, raspberries, loganberries, etc. Just wait till I get home—I'll make up for what I've missed. I wish I knew how Millard (his brother) is faring.

"Please write soon."
