Light Rains Help Drought Over State

Portland, July 26.—Moderate temperatures prevailed in western and northern districts and high temperatures were general in other portions of the state, according to the weekly summary of weather crop and conditions issued by the weather bureau. Excepting showers in a few localities the drought remained unbroken until the closing days of the week, when light rains occurred in western Oregon and late crops in non-irrigated sections were still suffering from moisture. While there was a reported scarcity of labor the farmers are combining forces and owing to the short crop yields are enabled to keep their work up to the average for the season. There was a superabundance of sunshine and some damage was caused by dislocating winds in northeastern counties.

Barley harvest is well along in the northern tier of counties with poor to fair yields, and will probably begin this week in Lane county. Fair crops of winter oats are being cut in Lane and Marion counties, but spring wheat, also, is in poor shape generally, was filling unsatisfactorily and being burnt badly by the hot, dry winds. Winter wheat and rye harvest progressed rapidly and threshing of the latter crop will begin shortly in the Willamette valley. While the yield does not appear to be up to the average, in some sections prospects are somewhat better than expected. The hot weather has been conducive to the growth of corn and the crop has done well under proper cultivation, but has not arrived at a stage where rain is needed to make good yields.

Some late fields of timothy are being cut but aside from this the general hay crop is practically all gathered. The second crop of alfalfa is well started where irrigation is possible, but water is getting scarce for this purpose. There has been little

or no improvement in pastures and ranges and the increasing danger of shortage of stock food is causing a great many cattle to be marketed, and if the adverse conditions continue greater numbers will have to be disposed of before the beginning of the dry feeding season.

Lack of moisture is beginning to have a deleterious effect on tree fruit on light lands in some localities. Present indications point to a fair crop of pears in Jackson county. Early peaches from home orchards are being marketed in Douglas county and are also ripe in Wasco county. Loganberry picking will finish next week in Marion county. The quality of the berries is excellent but the yield has been disappointing, says the report.
