## Switzerland's Internal Situation Is Grave

Ravel, Switzerland, Aug. 1.—The internal situation in Switzerland is assuming a grave aspect as the result of a conflict between federal authorities and the labor organizations. Matters came to a head at a meeting of the Swiss workmen's congress, organized by a socialist committee headed by Robert Grimes, which voted by a large majority that the federal council's reply to the workmen's claims was unsatisfactory, and that if further prompt negotiations failed in obtaining concessions a general strike would be called. In official circles the situation is regarded as serious. The claims of the workers were:

- First—Better arrangements for the food supply of the working class.
  - Second—A shorter work day, with wages fixed by a special bureau.
  - Third—Allowances for the increased cost of living and advances to government officials to enable them to lay in a stock of fuel and food for the winter.
  - Fourth—The abolition of restriction on the right of meeting and the withdrawal of the decree closing the frontier to foreign deserters and absentees.
- The reply of the federal council exceeded the third claim, but rejected the others.

## Air Raids Are Planned on Berlin

New York, Aug. 1.—An aerial offensive to cities of Germany, including Berlin, is possible, in the opinion of Major General W. S. Brancker, controller general of equipment of the British air ministry. Major General Brancker in a statement to the Associated Press, laid emphasis on the organization of the air forces on a basis quite independent of the land and sea. General Brancker believes, eventually, the United States will be obliged to create a secretary for air forces. For the success of the Allied cause, he feels strongly that the quicker air independence is established in this country the better. "We simply had to come to an air ministry in England," said General Brancker. "The Zeppelins and the Goetas, coupled with the experience gained when aviation was controlled by the army and navy, forced it upon us. You have no Hun air raids in this country to arouse you but it is much hoped that, lacking this stimulus, you will profit by our experience. "We need your help, your great resources, and a smaller organization in this country to co-operate with us on equal terms. "It is within the realm of certainty that we can bomb Berlin in the spring if not in the fall, with airplanes we have building, as we already have bombed Cologne and the Rhine cities, but we have not the numbers for a really big offensive, in my understanding of the term. We have plenty of planes, but we lack engines, and we have about reached the limit of capacity for engine production. "We have built up a big airplane program to take the Liberty motor and bomb Germany, but America can not now spare these motors, and so I fear that our airplanes will be wasted and the real offensive from the air seriously delayed. "The delivery of certain types of planes by flying them across the Atlantic is feasible. If we can fly to Berlin and back, which is more than 500 miles, we can fly from Newfoundland to the Azores (the longest lap of the journey), which is 1200 miles. This needs a big organization, air-dromes and repair plants in Newfoundland and the Azores."
