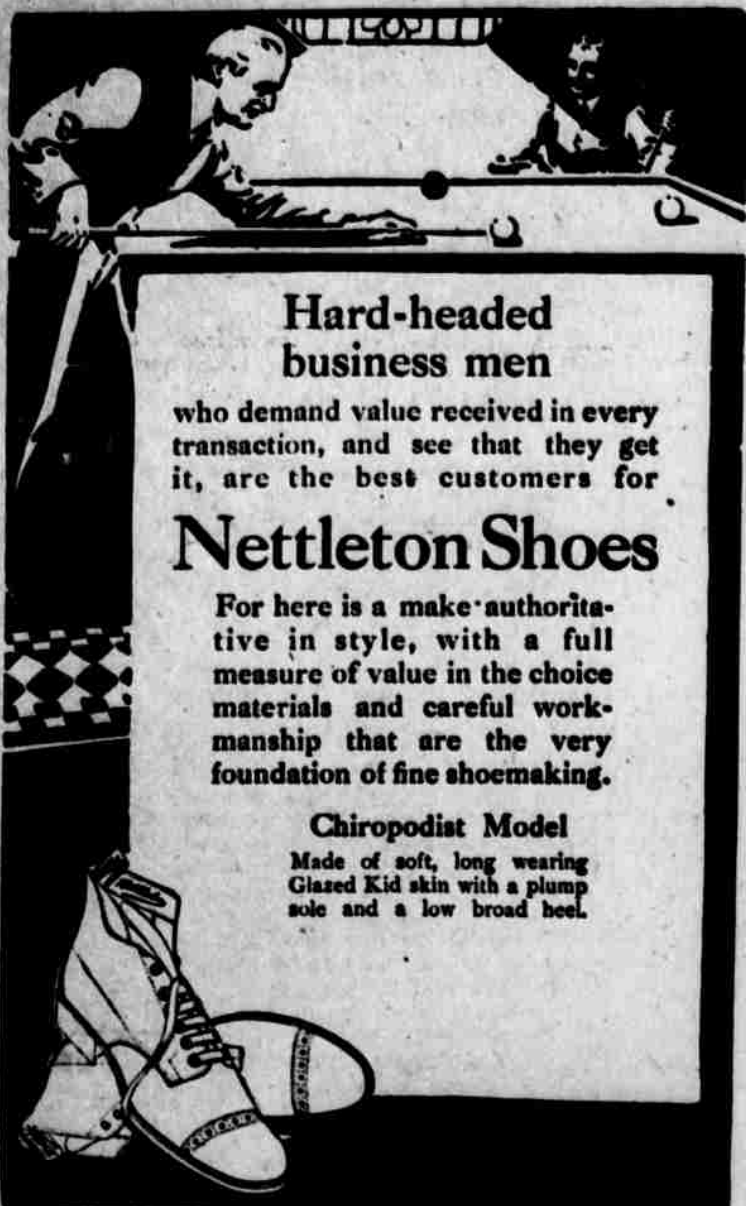

OLD PIONEER IS DEAD AT NORTH BEND

MAN WHO SETTLED HERE IN 1884 AND WHO WAS ACTIVE IN BUSINESS LIFE OF COMMUNITY, IS CALLED

The death of Antone Castel, one of Klamath county's earliest pioneers, is reported in a wire received this morning from his son, Alfred, at Marshfield.

The message states that the remains will be brought to this city, arriving tomorrow. Mr. Castel's death followed a prolonged illness at North Bend, Oregon. He will be buried in the I. O. O. F. cemetery.

The deceased was born in January, 1859, in Cologne, Germany. In his early life he went to sea, which he quit and came to Klamath county in 1884. He served two terms as county surveyor in 1893 and 1894, and was appointed postmaster in 1897. He conducted a livery stable here at

one time and in 1903 built the Klamath Falls brewery at the West End which he operated until a few years ago.

The date of the funeral, which will be held at the Whitlock chapel, will be announced later.
