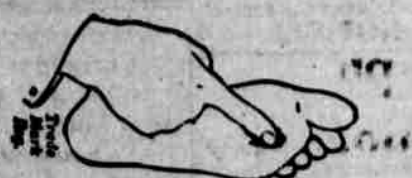

INSTRUCTIONS TO SATURDAY'S REGISTRANTS

WHEN, WHERE AND HOW MEN WHO BECAME 21 SINCE JUNE 5 MUST REGISTER FOR MILITARY DRAFT

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 21.—WHO MUST REGISTER.—All male persons (citizens or aliens) born between June 6, 1897, and August 24, 1897, both dates inclusive, except officers and enlisted men of the regular army, navy and marine corps, and the national guard while in Federal service, and officers in Officers' Reserve corps and enlisted men in Enlisted Reserve corps while in active service.

WHEN.—On Saturday, August 24, 1914, between 7 a. m. and 9 p. m.

WHERE.—At office of local board having jurisdiction where person to be registered permanently resides, or other place designated by that local board.

HOW.—Go in person on August 24 to your registration place. If you expect to be absent from home on August 24, go at once to the office of the local board where you happen to be. Have your registration card filled out and certified. Mail it to the local board having jurisdiction where you permanently reside. Inclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope, with your registration card, for the return of your registration certificate. Failure to get this certificate may cause you serious inconvenience. You must mail your registration card in time to reach your home local board on August 24. If you are sick on August 24 and unable to present yourself in person, send some competent friend. The clerk may deputize him or her to prepare your card.

INFORMATION.—If you are in doubt as to what to do or where to register, consult your local board.

PENALTY FOR NOT REGISTERING.—Failure to register is a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for one year. It may result in loss of valuable rights and privileges and immediate induction into military service.

CAUTION.—Do not confuse this call for registration, which is only for men who have reached their 21st birthday since June 5, with the coming registration of men from 18 to 20, and from 22 to 45, which will be held some time early in September.

COLD FACTS SHOWN THRU GERARD FILM

Ambassador Gerard's book, "My Four Years in Germany," has been read by thousands. It is a startling story, even on printed pages, but it is much more impressive when the facts are presented so that information may be gleaned by the eye. The trouble with the Allies, and especially with the United States, was that Germany at the beginning of the conflict was regarded as a civilized nation and entitled to be treated as such. The discovery of this mistake was only made after much damage had been accomplished, but the case is now thoroughly understood.

The intrigue and deception, the cruelty and malevolence of high Prussian officials and their vital disregard of law, promise or humanity, came to the front in the Gerard pictures as never before, and the light so forcibly thrown on the subject produced profound effect. Mr. Gerard must have had a hard time of it during the closing days of his stay in Germany. That his person was in constant danger cannot be doubted, and history has proved that he did not shrink from any call to duty at any place.

The film is in ten reels and shows many almost unbelievable incidents, but everyone is vouched for as cold facts by Ambassador Gerard. It comes to the Houston Opera House next Saturday and Sunday nights.

HUNS HAVE COMMENCED TRADING WITH FINLAND

AMSTERDAM, Aug. 22.—Germany has concluded a commercial agreement with Finland for six months tacitly renewable unless one party gives notice of termination.

Germany has already sent a small quantity of potatoes and salt of which there are none in Finland. Finland will supply Germany with lumber, cellulose, woodpulp, matches and part with small old, stocks of oil fat and rubber. Germany further expects to export iron, coal, benzine, chemicals, medicines, and dyes.

Finland, under the agreement, may sell to all neutrals and ship goods thru German territory under a system which guarantees that the goods are only for the use of neutrals.
