or this. I haven't seen a tree that would make me think of home. The United States. Six or eight feet tall are cut up one way and the bark or chips left on the board to give width. The timber is hardwood. Railroad ties are made of steel.

The trains are dirty things; the wheels have spokes. Think of it. Each car will carry 22 persons, eight in each compartment. The compartments are entered from the side of the car and there is nothing in them but two seats each for four persons.

"You have heard much of French wine. It is bum stuff. I helped drink seven quart bottles and didn't get even a sign of a kick. A child could drink enough to swim in and yet never cultivate an appetite. It could turn one to four francs a quart, according to how much avarice is in the Frenchman's belly. A franc is 10 cents.

Of all things which an American

observes most persistently is the lower standard of living in Europe. Americans, even soldiers drawing a paltry \$30 per month, overwhelm the natives here with their generosity and appetite for the comforts and luxuries (I mean necessities) of life. If a people's civilization is measured by its wants and I think that is the conclusion of students, America is many notches above Europe in the scale of civilization.

"I saw some German prisoners at work in this camp today. They are husky, blonde fellows, apparently well fed and there is no sign of dejection on their faces. I cannot believe they are sorry of their present station."

Mr. Fell has sent home a letter which has been received by the soldiers from King George of England and which he naturally prizes very highly. The note has been written by the monarch in pen and ink and then stenographed. It follows: "Soldiers of the United States, the people of the British Isles welcome you on your way to take your stand beside the armies of many nations now fighting in the old world the great battle for human freedom.

"The Allies will gain new heart and spirit in your company. I wish

that I could shake the hand of each one of you and bid you God speed on your mission. GEORGE R. I. April, 1918."
