LUMBER PRODUCTION CAREFULLY RECORDED

PORTLAND, Aug. 31.—The United States forest service has recently undertaken the collection of data on the current production and shipment of lumber, according to a statement issued by District Forester George H. Cecil, of Portland. This work is being done at the request of the war industries board. The collection of data will be on a rather large scale, and will show the distribution and use being made of the lumber cut in this district.

GERMANS TOLD ALLIES' RESERVES WERE USED UP

NEW YORK, Aug. 31.—Long before Marshal Foch began his brilliant counter offensive on the Marne, the Germans had been told that his reserves had been exhausted. This is shown by a Wolff Bureau dispatch published in the Berlin Tageblatt, which described the fighting about Chateau Thierry.

"The hope of the Entente regarding a decisive intervention of the great army of maneuver has been definitely shattered. The proved army of reserves which the council of Versailles played out its trump exists as such no longer," read the dispatch. "The great victory of the crown prince has shattered a considerable part of the enemy's fighting force and has resulted in the dissolution and complete dispersal of the Foch army of maneuver. The tremendous losses suffered by the Entente on the extensive fronts between Ypres and Rheims will be difficult to replace." This was published in Germany about a month before Marshal Foch struck the Germans on the Marne and drove them back to the Vesle. It probably shows why the German public was so greatly surprised by Marshal Foch's brilliant stroke.

SCIENCE CHURCH AIDS IN FRANCE

Christian Science camp welfare work is now being carried on in 45 army and navy camps in the United States under direction of the Christian Science War Relief and Camp Welfare committee of the First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston. There are at present about 70 men and 15 women engaged in this work, the women serving mainly as welfare room attendants. Conducted at first independently, the camp welfare work has been merged with the war relief work which the Christian Scientists were doing in foreign countries before the United States entered the war. For both these purposes about one million dollars have been raised. The aim of the Christian Science camp workers is to be as helpful as possible to all the men in the camps, whether or not they are Christian Scientists, and particularly to give assistance which may not be available at the time or place through any of the other camp welfare agencies. —Boston Sunday Advertiser.
