

UNITED STATES WILL CONTINUE WAR

ENEMY ACCEDES TO EVACUATION CLAUSE

REPLY IS RECEIVED SATURDAY NIGHT BY UNOFFICIAL CHANNELS—MOVE IS AGREEMENT WITH REICHSTAG MAJORITY

WOULD HAVE MEETING TO AGREE UPON THE DETAILS OF THE APPLICATION OF TERMS. AUSTRIA-HUNGARY IS INCLUDED

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 14.—The German government, in reply to the recent note sent by President Wilson, accepts the terms laid down by the President in his address of January 8th and subsequent addresses.

The text of the German reply was received Saturday night thru unofficial channels.

The note says the responsibility for this step toward peace has been formed by conferences, and is in agreement with the great majority of the reichstag, and that the German government, in accordance with the Austro-Hungarian government, agrees to comply with the proposition of President Wilson in regard to the evacuation of occupied territories.

The text of the note follows:

"In reply to the questions of the President of the United States of America, the German government hereby declares that the German government has accepted the terms laid down by President Wilson in his address of January 8th, and in subsequent addresses, on the foundation of permanent peace of justice consequent.

"Its object in entering into discussion would be only to agree upon practical details of application of these terms. The German government believes that the governments of the powers associated with the Government of the United States also take the position held by President Wilson in his address.

The German government, in accordance with the Austro-Hungarian government, for the purpose of bringing about an armistice, declares itself ready to comply with the propositions of the President in regard to evacuation.

"The present German government, which has undertaken the responsibility for this step towards peace, has been formed by conferences and is in agreement with the great majority of the reichstag.

"The chancellor is supported in all of his actions by the will of the majority. He speaks in the name of the German government and of the German people."

OFFICIAL WHITE HOUSE STATEMENT

(EXTRAORDINARY OVERSEAS SERVICE)

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 14.—THE WHITE HOUSE HAS ISSUED THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT REGARDING PEACE TERMS PROPOSED BY GERMANY:

"THE GOVERNMENT WILL CONTINUE TO SEND 250,000 MEN WITH THEIR SUPPLIES EVERY MONTH, AND THERE WILL BE NO RELAXATION IN THE PROSECUTION OF THE OFFENSIVE

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 14.—Germany's reply to the President reached the Swiss legation today, and is identical with the text received Saturday night.

After being delivered to Lansing, the President called a conference with Lansing, Baker, Daniels and Colonel House.

After the conference the President was left alone in his study. It is believed he will act quickly and positively.

LONDON, Oct. 14.—No armistice unless accompanied by a German unconditional surrender, is the dominant note in the comments on the peace situation.

The newspapers see in the German attempt to open negotiations merely an endeavor to avoid disaster.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 14.—Senator Lodge has introduced a resolution declaring it to be the sense of the senate that no further communication be had with Germany except on the question of unconditional surrender.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 14.—Senator Ashurst of Arizona, after conferring with the President, said:

"The President will take no action that will weaken in the smallest degree, the successes of the Americans and the Allies in the field. On the contrary, what he will do will rather strengthen the military situation.

LONDON, Oct. 14.—The resignation of Prince Maximilian as chancellor is now probable, according to reports from Holland. These quote the Berlin newspapers as saying the chancellor's retirement is regarded as inevitable.

CATTLE AND SHEEP GOING OUT RAPIDLY

PASTURES OF COUNTY STILL FULL OF STOCK, IN SPITE OF THE BIG SHIPMENTS ALREADY EXPORTED

MINNESOTA IS DEVASTATED BY FEARFUL FIRES

ONE THOUSAND ESTIMATED DEAD AND LARGE SECTION OF STATE IN RUINS AS RESULT OF MONSTER FOREST FIRES.

DULUTH, Oct. 14.—A large section of northwestern Minnesota is in smoldering ruins with a death list estimated at one thousand persons, as a result of forest fires. A dozen towns and cities have been destroyed.

LOAN PLEDGES ARE GRADUALLY NEARING QUOTA

A total of \$449,800 in subscriptions for the Fourth Liberty Loan is reported today for Klamath County by Chairman Arthur Wilson, which leaves a balance of \$29,200 to be raised before the close of the campaign.
