One Cent's Worth of Electricity and What It Will Do.

No one today questions the wisdom of using electricity for the large industrial power and light plants; for the operation of street, suburban or interurban railways, or for lighting street, office and factory. The fact, however, not so generally recognized, is that it is the only practical means today of producing heat for cooking, etc., and that its more extended use in this direction would greatly lighten the tasks in the household.

The opinion seems to prevail that the cost of operation of cooking and other household devices is prohibitive. The following table, the result of tests, shows just what this cost is, and how very small it reallip is when using the valous devices now on the market. The tables are based on the usual charge of 16 cents per K. W. hour:

Table 1---Heating Devices

One cent's worth of Electricity:

2—Will keep the 6 ½ inch disk stove hot for 24 minutes; and the 5-inch disk stove hot for 9 minutes. (This will beke 6 to 5 griddle cakes per minute, or 36 to 45 griddle cakes for 1 cent.

3—Will operate the 500 wait toaster for 15 minutes, toasting at the rate of a little better than a slice per minute.

4—Will operate the physician's heating pad (a substitute for the hot water bottle), for over 2 hours continuously.

5—Will operate a 6-inch frying pan for 12 minutes; cooking a steak in about 8 minutes.


