## BURLESON SAYS U. S. SHOULD OWN THE WIRES

### POSTMASTER GENERAL IN ANNUAL MESSAGE TODAY PAYS DRUG GOVERNMENT CONTROL WHEN FEARED IS OBTAINED.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4.—Telephone and telegraph lines of the country, now under government control, should become government owned at the conclusion of peace and the expiration of the provisions of the act under which the utilities are now controlled, Postmaster General Burleson declared in his annual report made public today. The war has shown that government ownership of telephones and telegraphs "is not only sound, but practical," the Postmaster General says, in repeating the recommendation which he has made in previous reports but which he makes for the first time in his report as the government agency controlling the nation's communication lines.

"The experience as a result of the present war has fully demonstrated that the principle of government ownership of the telephones and telegraphs is not only sound but practical," Mr. Burleson says. "It has been necessary as a war measure for Congress to consider legislation authorizing the President to assume control of the telegraph and telephone systems of the country. While such control is temporary, and will end only with the ratification of the Treaty of Peace, yet the best results can be obtained only when these systems are owned by the government, made a part of the postal establishment, and operated solely with a view to serving the public and not making profit or guaranteeing returns to the investment. Government ownership of the telegraphs and telephones would no longer be a temporary war measure but a permanent one."
