FORMER CITY MAN RECEIVES ROYAL HONOR

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 19.—William Sperry, San Franciscan who entered the war zone when Germany invaded Belgium, was commissioned a first lieutenant in the American Army and presented with a bronze medal by King Albert of Belgium for distinguished services according to word received here by his father, George Sperry, who is prominent in business, society and club life here.

Sperry first served with Hoover in Belgium, then entered the Belgian army and afterwards was a captain in the Red Cross. When America entered the war he sought service with the United States Army, but damaged ear drums prevented his acceptance at that time. He underwent treatments that restored his hearing and he finally gained a place in the fighting forces of Uncle Sam.

Lieutenant Sperry is well known in Klamath Falls where he was identified with the old tub and pail factory.

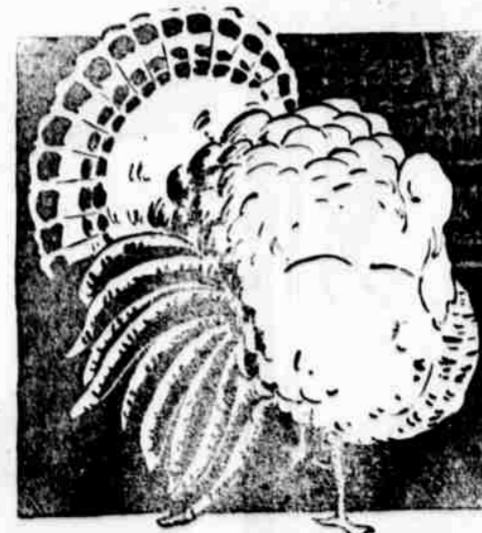
