YANKEE AVIATOR SHOT BY GERMAN CAPTORS

COPENHAGEN, Dec. 21.—Murder of a young American aviator by German prison guards after the armistice was signed was reported today.

A young American aviator named Coehony, who was a prisoner in a camp near Stralsund, went outside the barbed wire enclosure about 7 o'clock in the evening of December 5. A British officer declared during an interview published in the newspaper Koenbenhavn.

The German guards promptly shot him dead, despite the fact the armistice had been signed. Coehony was about 27 years old.
