PROMINENT PORTLANDER BOOTLEGGER

MAN WHO SHOT AND KILLED CARPENTER LAST WEEK COMITS SUICIDE IN PORTLAND JAIL YESTERDAY.

PORTLAND, Dec. 24.—Robert Warfield, contract manager of the Home Telephone Company and Gus Emrich and George Fifer, pleaded guilty here to a charge of bootlegging and were sentenced to the County jail. Warfield's sentence was for three months and the others for thirty days.

N. Carlson slayer of Gus Johnson who shot and killed Gus Johnson last week, committed suicide in the County jail yesterday by cutting his throat while shaving. He died twenty minutes later. There were thirty prisoners present. Carlson had told the officers and his story had been substantiated by his wife, that he shot Johnson for attacks upon Mrs. Carlson believing that both their lives were in danger.

POCATELLO, Idaho, Dec. 23.—Sam Soo Hoo, who bore the distinction of being the only Chinese from the state of Idaho to join the American forces, is dead from wounds received in action, according to word received here by a cousin, Ching Sui, of this city. Sam Soo Hoo is thought to be the first Chinese from the north west to make the supreme sacrifice. Sam Soo Hoo volunteered in June, 1917 and left for Camp Lewis with a contingent of Bannock, Idaho draftees. His father is said to be president of Portland, Ore.

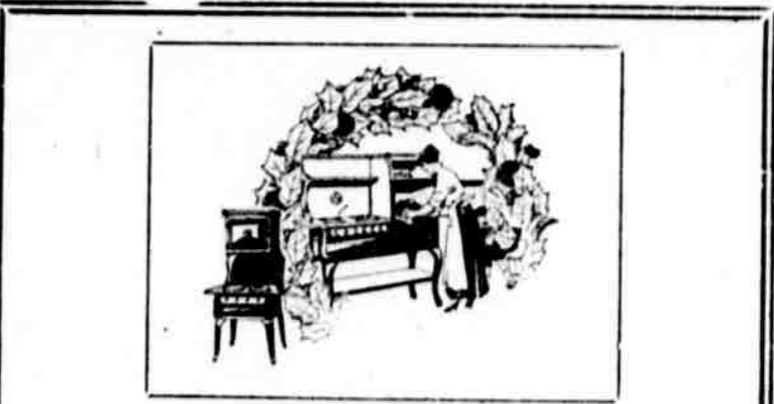
