LABOR PROBLEM CONSIDERED BY JAP LEADERS

TOKIO (Correspondence of the Associated Press).—The labor question is receiving wide attention in Japan. The Home Office of the Imperial Government has established a Relief Works Committee to deal with the problem of unemployment due to the cessation of war-work. A firm policy is favored on the ground that freedom of holding meetings does not tend to lessen labor discontent, and that, in Japan, permission to organize unions does not seem as promising as the establishment of a Labor Arbitration Court. Meanwhile a radical and interesting step has been taken by K. Matsukata, president of the Kawasaki Dock Co., of Kobe, who, in distributing about \$5,000,000 profits at the end of the year, has allotted three-fourths to his workmen and other employees.

The Yuaikai has about 30,000 members and has been promoted by the American Unitarian Mission in Tokio.
