THE LINK RIVER DAM

The Herald called the attention of its readers last night to the fight that is being made by R. E. Bradbury to prevent the construction of the dam across Link River, and the segregation from the Klamath project of any of the power sites that came into being as a result of the creating of this undertaking.

So far the California-Oregon Power company has been successful in overcoming every obstacle that has been placed in its way to prevent its monopolization of the power of the Klamath River. But it has reached the end of its rope, and The Herald would now warn it to drop the matter, and not try and steal from the people of the Klamath project that on which dependence has been placed to meet the cost of putting water on their lands.

As to Mr. Bradbury, The Herald wants to see him in as president of the Klamath Irrigation district, and it further wants to see him name his assistants. The present directors have declared that a mistake has been made in the granting of the contract, and since they failed in their efforts to stop it, then it is up to them to step aside and let a man take the lead who has the courage to openly defy the opposition that has been raised against him, and who the Herald knows will win for the people of the project in a struggle that demands no wavering and calls for the leadership of a man who has the courage of his convictions and the backbone to stand up and fight for them.

LENINE IS GOING TO HAVE A GENUINE BOLSHEVIKI LOVE FEAST WHICH WILL PUT PARIS CONFERENCE OFF THE MAP

STOCKHOLM, Feb. 6.—An exhortation from Premier Lenine to all the Bolsheviki Committees in Germany, Austria, and Poland, the Baltic

provinces and Finland to convoke a Communist peace conference has been made. The proposed meeting is intended to eclipse the peace conference at Paris and the socialist conference at Berne.

The invitation which is published in Petrograd newspapers decrees that the Bolsheviki alone will have the right to take the initiative at the proposed meeting.

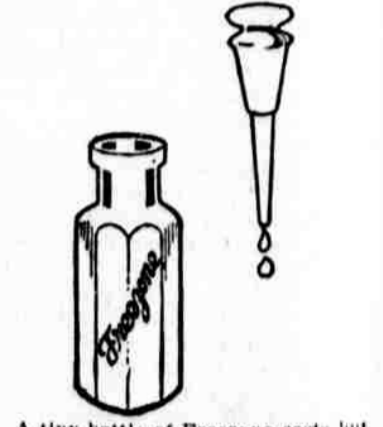
MRS. ROOSEVELT TO VISIT GRAVE OF SON IN FRANCE.
