In the Matter of the Organization of "Upper Van Brimmer Drainage District."

To the Honorable County Court of State of Oregon, for Klamath County:
The undersigned petitioners respectfully represent that it is their desire to form a drainage district in accordance with Chapter 340 of the General Laws of the State of Oregon for the year 1915, and amendments thereof as contained in Chapter 414 of General Laws of the State of Oregon for the year 1917, for the purpose of having lands hereinafter described reclaimed and protected by drainage or otherwise from the effects of water, for agricultural purposes, stating and alleging relative thereto as follows:

That the name proposed for such district is "Upper Van Brimmer Drainage District."

II.

That the boundary line of said proposed district are as follows:

Beginning at the point where the Van Brimmer ditch intersects Lost River in the SW 1/4 of Section 21, Township 40 south, Range 10 east of Willamette Meridian; thence southerly and along said Van Brimmer ditch to a point where said ditch intersects the north and south line between Sections 33 and 34, said township and range; thence north to east and west line through the center of Section 34, said township and range; thence east one-fourth mile; thence south one-fourth mile; thence east one-fourth mile; thence south to township line between townships 40 and 41 south; thence east to Lost River; thence northerly and following said Lost River to point of beginning.

That the total acreage included within said proposed district is one thousand one hundred twenty acres.

IV.

That the reclamation and protection of said lands is for agricultural purposes and that such proposed reclamation and protection will be conducive to public welfare, utility and benefit.

VI.
That all of the lands included in said proposed district are properly included therein, and will be beneficially affected by the operations of the proposed district.

VII.
That the benefits of such proposed reclamation and protection will exceed the damage done, and that the best interests of the land included and of the owners of such land as a whole and of the public at large, will be promoted by the formation and proposed operations of said district.

VIII.
That the formation of a drainage district under the provisions of Chapter 340 of the General Laws of the State of Oregon for the year 1915 and amendments thereof as contained in Chapter 414 of the General Laws of the State of Oregon for the year 1917, is a proper and advantageous method of accomplishing the reclamation and protection of the lands included therein.

IX.
That to accomplish the purposes herein set forth, it is proposed to construct through and across said district, in general, from the westerly boundary thereof easterly to Lost River as many drain ditches, tile lines and laterals as competent engineering judgment may deem necessary to conduct and carry away from said lands surplus irrigation and other water that may accumulate thereon, having regard to such construction as would be properly chargeable upon the entire district.

X.
That the undersigned hereby agree to pay any and all expenses incurred, and any tax or taxes that may be levied against their lands, for the purpose of paying the expense of organizing or attempting to organize the proposed district.

Wherefore, Your petitioners pray that the lands included within the description set forth in Paragraph II. of this petition, or such of them as may be found by the Court to be properly included in the said proposed district, either permanently or until further investigation and surveys may permit elimination, shall be declared organized into a drainage district to be known as "Upper Van Brimmer Drainage District."
