ized city scavenger, Ed Hunter, or a duly authorized licensee of the city. The expenses of garbage removal is left to private contract between the citizen and the city scavenger or licensee, but a higher rate for garbage removal cannot be charged than the following: Contents of 10 gallon or similar receptacles not to exceed two tons per week, per tank, 25c; larger receptacles or more frequent removals at not to exceed a proportionately higher cost. Garbage and trash in piles not exceeding 1 cubic yard in volume at not to exceed 50c for each pile. This ordinance provides a fine of not less than \$5 or more than \$50, or imprisonment not less than two or more than twenty days, for the violation of any of these provisions. 19-101 I. R. Petition for Formation of District In the County Court of the State of Oregon, for Klamath County. In the Matter of the Organization of "Upper Van Brimmer Drainage District." To the Honorable County Court of State of Oregon, for Klamath County: The undersigned petitioners respectfully represent that it is their desire to form a drainage district in accordance with Chapter 340 of the General Laws of the State of Oregon for the year 1915, and amendments thereof as contained in Chapter 414 of General Laws of the State of Oregon for the year 1917, for the purpose of having lands hereinafter described reclaimed and protected by drainage or otherwise from the effects of water, for agricultural purposes, stating and alleging relative thereto as follows:

I. That the name proposed for such district is "Upper Van Brimmer Drainage District." II. That the boundary line of said proposed district are as follows: Beginning at the point where the Van Brimmer ditch intersects Lost River in the SW 1/4 of Section 21, Township 40 south, Range 10 east of Willamette Meridian; thence southerly and along said Van Brimmer ditch to a point where said ditch intersects the north line of Section 28, said township and range; thence east one-fourth mile; thence south one-half mile; thence west to Van Brimmer ditch; thence southerly and along said ditch to point where said ditch intersects the north and south line between Sections 33 and 34, said township and range; thence north to east and west line through the center of Section 34, said township and range; thence east one-fourth mile; thence south one-fourth mile; thence east one-fourth mile; thence south to township line between townships 40 and 41 south; thence east to Lost River; thence northerly and following said Lost River to point of beginning.

III. That the total acreage included within said proposed district is one thousand one hundred twenty acres. IV. That the names of the owners of land in said district, as shown by the records of Klamath County, Oregon, and the acreage owned by each, are as follows: R. H. NOTICE

Notice is hereby given to the people of Klamath Falls to have their garbage ready to be carried away on the 1st and 15th of each and every month. No accumulation of garbage under the ordinance passed February 24, 1919, is to remain on the premises more than fifteen days, except ashes, tin cans, glass and garbage of similar nature, which must be hauled away every ninety days.

The following subjects come under the head of garbage: Every accumulation of animal, fruit or vegetable matter, liquid or otherwise, that attends the preparation, use, cooking, eating or storing of meat, fish, fowl, fruit or vegetables; ashes, tin cans, bottles, glass or discarded articles of similar character; all trees, vines, brushes and lawn trimmings, dead leaves and trash from gardens. All ashes, glass, bottles, tin cans and garbage of a similar nature shall be placed in a suitable receptacle separate and apart from the other classes of garbage above described. Persons may dispose of their garbage by burying it on the premises in accordance with the rules of the Board of Health, or the owner of the garbage may cart the same away, but no person shall engage in the garbage business except the duly author-
