mates satisfactory:

Be it hereby resolved, that said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of Tenth street from Main street northerly to Lincoln street, and High street from Ninth street easterly to Eleventh street, in-cluding intersections, be, and the

And be it further resolved, that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portions of Centh street and High street in accordance with said plans, specifica-tions and estimates ,said improve-ments to consist of paving said portion of said streets with oil macadam pavement, at an estimated cost, including cement sidewalks, curbing and grading, of \$18,696.87; or cement pavement, at an estimated cost, and grading, of \$25,000.00. Said im-provement to include grading, rolling

and curbing.
