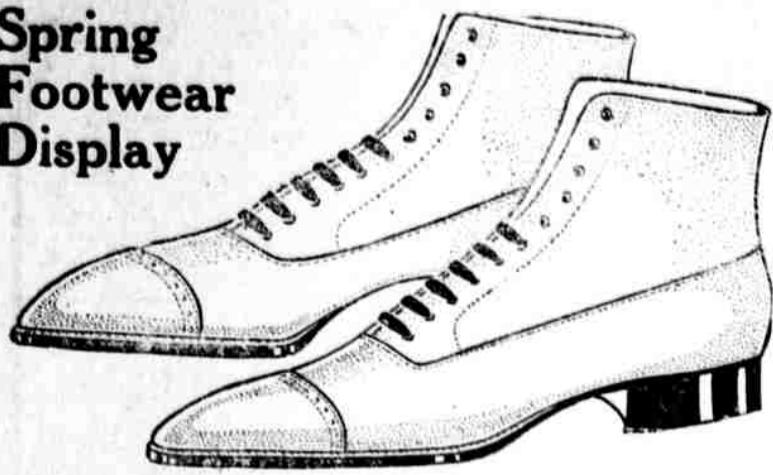

BANDIT VICTIM HOME AT LAST

PORTLAND, March 19.—George A. Kyle, Portland railroad engineer, once held captive by Chinese bandits, is a guest at the Oregon Hotel arriving in this city from California Saturday.

It was while in the employ of a railroad company that Mr. Kyle had his sensational experience with Chinese outlaws about a year ago. He along with another American, was kidnapped from a Chinese city and robbed inland by a band of brigands and held for ransom. While in their custody, Mr. Kyle was almost daily threatened with death, and never knew at sundown whether he would live to see the light of another day. The other captive was finally released after payment of his ransom, but Kyle was still held. He was unable to communicate with the outside world and was constantly under a heavy guard. After several weeks of captivity his employers paid the ransom asked and his release followed.

JAPAN-CHINA SECRET PACTS SAID FOUND

VANCOUVER, B. C., March 17.—Copies of secret treaties between China and Japan, which may be these reported stolen from Chinese delegates to the peace conference as they passed thru Japan, have been discovered by the police here during an investigation of the Chinese Nationalist society. Discovery of the documents was made known by Malcolm Reid, dominion police agent, in testimony at the trial of Chen Sheu Yen, an alleged member of that organization, on a charge of being a member of an unlawful society.

Mr. Reid testified that the society was spreading steadily and offered in evidence a letter addressed to Dr. Sun Yet Sen, president of the society in China, and signed by the defendant, stating that \$10,000 had been collected here for the cause. Photographs of Chinese youths who were reported to be training at Oriental military schools in Calgary and Lethbridge for a revolution in South China also were introduced. Death threats have been made against the men who are acting as interpreters at the trial, Mr. Reid said.

QUARTER OF ARMY HOME.

WASHINGTON, D. C. March 18.—Four hundred and seventy thousand seven hundred and thirty six officers and men of the American Expeditionary forces had sailed for home on March 13th. This represents twenty four per cent of Pershing's forces in France on November 11th. There are 1,478,580 men left in France.
