ized city scavenger, Ed Hunter, or a duly authorized licensee of the city. The expenses of garbage removal is left to private contract between the citizen and the city scavenger or licensee, but a higher rate for garbage removal cannot be charged than the following:

Contents of 10 gallon or similar receptacles not to exceed two tons per week, per tank, 25c; larger receptacles or more frequent removals at not to exceed a proportionately higher cost. Garbage and trash in piles not to exceed 50c for each pile.

This ordinance provides a fine of not less than \$5 or more than \$50, or imprisonment not less than two or more than twenty days, for the violation of any of these provisions.

Garbage cans provided for in the ordinance must be placed at a point convenient for the garbage collector. 10-10t I. R. STRUBLE, Mayor.
