SLEEPING SICKNESS **GRADUALLY SPREADS**

NEW YORK, March 22 .- Cases of sleeping sickness, the new malady, which is believed to be an aftermath of influenza, are scattered over the country but not in alarming numbers. Twenty-one deaths have occurred . More than 100 actual cases have been listed in 17 cities but there are believed to be many as yet unreported

Cleveland and Springfield, III. each reported 65 cases. New York has 40. Chicago's number is unknown, the health authorities not making it public.

Other points showing a "trace" or the malady are: Richmond, Va; San Francisco, Fort Worth, Calumet, Mich.; Minneapolis, Des Moines, Los Angeles, Lancaster, Ohio; Boston, Harrisburg, Albany and Pittsburg.

In this disease the sufferer lapses into a state of coma. In many instances recovery is complete. Some have been known to sleep for from eight to ten days and then "come to life" in good health. A number of communities are considering taking precautions similar to those taken against the spread of influenza.
