Be it further Resolved, That the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portions of Pine, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth and Seventh streets in accordance with the said plans, specifications and estimates, said improvements to consist of paving said portions of said streets with bituminous pavement at an estimated cost, including cement sidewalks, curbing and grading, of \$43,393.00; oil macadam pavement at an estimated cost, including cement sidewalks, curbing and grading of \$29,973.00; or concrete pavement, with curbing and grading at an estimated cost of \$40,819.00, said improvement in either event to include grading, rolling and curbing; said pavement to be 40 feet wide with sidewalk 6 feet wide on Fourth, Fifth, Sixth and Seventh streets and 4 feet wide on Pine street, and parking strip leveled throughout the entire distance of said improvement, except at intersections where said pavement is to be 60 feet wide.
