RESIDENTS OF EMERALD ISLE GIVEN BIG BOOST IN THEIR FIGHT FOR FREEDOM BY FOLK OF GOLDEN STATE

SAN FRANCISCO, April 16 .- Ireland's attempts to interest the Uniter States in her efforts toward selfdetermination were outlined at a mass meeting here, called by the executive of the Irish freedom fund to close the campaign in the state for a propaganda fund. Speakers were United States Senator James D. Phelan, Archbishop Edward J. Hanna, Congressman John I, Nolan, Mayor Jas. Rolph and others.

San Francisco alone had subscribed over \$100,000 for the campaign. But \$50,000 was pledged for the entire state.

"America never fought for any reason other than a spiritual ideal," said Archbishop Hanna in a brief address, "Ireland is striving toward a spiritual ideal, In 1776 America fought for the ideal of freedom and


