

CASUALTIES OF
YANKEES HEAVYTOTAL HAS NOW REACHED NEARLY
IN THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND,
AND SEVENTY FIVE THOUSAND
AND BURIED IN FRANCEWASHINGTON, April 10.—Nearly
75,000 American fighting men now
lie buried in France, according to
the latest casualty advices to the war
department.Advices up to April 2 summarized
the American casualties as follows:

Killed in Action	33,705
Died of wounds	14,154
Died of disease	22,654
Died of other causes	4,056

Total dead	74,569
Taken prisoner	4,777
Missing in action	4,951
Wounded	198,037

Grand total 282,338
The total casualties shown do not
represent individuals, but casualties
reported, as most of the "died of
wounds" were previously reported
wounded and in many cases men
have been wounded more than once.

LEGAL NOTICES

NOTICE TO EXTERMINATE
GROUND SQUIRRELSBy order of the County Court of
Klamath County, State of Oregon,
in pursuance of State Statute, relat-
ing to Extermination and Eradica-
tion of Ground Squirrels, other
Obnoxious Rodents and Predatory
Animals:Every person, firm, co-partnership,
company or corporation residing on,
owning, leasing, occupying, posses-
sing or having charge of or dominion
over any land, building, wharf or
dock infested with Oregon ground
squirrels in Klamath County, Oregon,
is hereby notified to begin at once to
effectively exterminate and destroy all
such ground squirrels.The following poison for mixing
and instructions for use thereof is the
method most expedient and effective
to be used for the extermination and
destruction of such ground squirrels,
and is hereby recommended, to-wit:
alkaloid strychnine used on oats,
mixed according to the following for-
mula and manner to-wit:Oats, clean, good, heavy oats, 29
quarts; strychnine (powdered al-
kaloid), 1 ounce; bicarbonate of
soda (baking soda), 1 ounce; thin
starch paste, 3/4 pint; heavy corn
syrup, 1/2 pint; glycerine, 1 ounce;
saccharine, 1/2 ounce; salt, 4 table-
spoonful.

This material should be mixed as fol-

lows: Mix dry, one ounce powdered
strychnine and one ounce of baking
soda. Make a starch paste of: Stir
one tablespoonful of glass starch into
one-half cup of cold water, then pour
it into one-half pint of boiling water
and cook until a thick, clear, trans-
parent paste is formed which is free
from lumps. When paste is formed,
add the dry mixture of strychnine
and soda; stir until thoroughly mixed.
Add one-half pint of heavy corn syrup
(Karo is best); stir in four table-
spoonful of salt; add one ounce of
glycerine (Fruit walls). Add, while
stirring, one teaspoonful for one-
eighth ounce of saccharine. Pour
this over twenty quarts of good, clean
heavy oats, and mix until each kernel
is coated. For convenience in hand-
ling, the grain should be now spread
out to dry, stirring it up occasionally
to prevent drying in a cake.One quart of the poisoned grain
mixed as aforesaid is sufficient for
forty to sixty baits, and this quantity
scattered along squirrel trails or on
climb hard places on the surface about
the holes will not endanger stock.
Strychnine in any form other than
the powdered strychnine (alkaloid)
is not effective in the above formula.From the date hereof until May
15th is the most effective time to
poison and destroy the ground squir-
rels.

The County Court of Klamath

County, Oregon, has secured a sup-
ply of strychnine and the other ingre-
dients necessary for the mixture, and
a quantity thereof has been mixed
and is now on sale to the farmers or
persons interested at actual cost, and
may be had by applying to the under-
signed at his office in the Loomis
building, Klamath Falls, Oregon.If any person herein designated
shall within thirty days from the first
publication of this notice, fail to be-
gin in good faith to exterminate,
effective means, said ground squirrels
eradicate and destroy, according to
the method aforesaid, or by any otherherein designated, the County Court
of Klamath County, Oregon, will ap-
point a person or persons to proceed
with the extermination and eradica-
tion of such ground squirrels, and
the cost thereof incurred will be as-
sessed to such land, building, wharf
or dock, and unless paid will become
a lien against the same, for the ex-
termination of said ground squirrels.This notice is published pursuant
to the statute in such case made and
provided, and for two consecutive
weeks or three times, and all persons
described therein are required to take
