

GERMANY SAID UNABLE TO PAY COSTS OF WAR

LONDON, April 17.—It will be impossible to cripple Germany without to some extent crippling British trade, Charles S. Adde, a director of the Bank of England, told the Institute of Bankers recently. "To secure the maximum indemnity for the minimum of injury to the trade of the country," he said, "it would be necessary to afford Germany free access to raw material and freedom to arrange her own mode of paying the indemnity. This would be for a moderate amount well within her taxable capacity and on such terms as to keep alive in the debtor the hope of redemption within a reasonable time. "A crippled Germany could not pay a penal indemnity and to suppose that in crippling a nation you thereby gain a guarantee of continuous peace is chimerical. The only guarantee of peace is that having beaten the enemy you should be ready to fight him again whenever he likes. "The idea of Germany being able to pay, under any circumstances, the amount of \$120,000,000,000, at which the expenditure of the allies was estimated, should be dismissed as impracticable."

MEXICO READY FOR DRY U. S.

CALEXICO, Cal., April 17.—The United States will become "bone dry" on June 30 next but Mexico, Lower California, literally just across the street from this city will be an oasis abounding in those liquid refreshments forbidden American citizens by the War Time Prohibition Act in accordance with the plans of a group of Mexican capitalists, announced recently. Construction of a distillery is contemplated for the preparation of rum, whiskey, gin, brandy and other ardent spirits. It is announced the plant will cost in excess of \$150,000.

A large brewery was started recently and is nearing completion and the construction of the distillery will follow, according to Fred Dato and Frank Dunlevy, said to be the promoters of the project.

The city limits of Mexicali on one side of the American boundary and the city limits of Calexico on the other side are almost identical.

Mexicali is the seat of the government of Lower California, whose head is Gov. Esteban Cantu.
