EAST CONTROL OF SPORTS TO BE CONTESTED

SEATTLE, Wash., April 18.—War against what has been termed absolute control of college sports by the eastern National Collegiate Association has been opened by Coach Claude J. Hunt, athletic director of the University of Washington here. The Association, Hunt recently asserted is "a farce" and represents only a few of the eastern institutions.

Recognition on for Western and middle western colleges and universities is desired by Hunt. He hopes the national association will be forced to admit western institutions into its councils. If his is not done he thinks the institutions west of the Mississippi should form an association of their own and make it a strong as the national body.

"We can have a national association west of the Mississippi just as well as they can have one in the east" Hunt said recently. "The present association is national in name only and is completely dominated by Harvard and Yale. What they say goes. The schools of the west do not have a look-in."

Hunt asserted that almost all the association meetings are held in New York, too far for many western delegates. If the association is to be made national in scope the meetings should be held in different parts of the country so representatives of all institutions can attend.

AMERICAN MEDICOS GOING TO BALKANS.

ATHENS, April 18.—Eleven women doctors attached to the American Woman's Hospital, of New York, and fifteen United States army surgeons have been assigned to the American Red Cross for civil relief work in the Balkans. These doctors, who are in charge of Major Burke C. Hamilton, of Goshen, N. Y., medical director of the American Red Cross Commission to the Balkans, will be sent to Serbia, Montenegro and Albania, where there is reported to be much illness. They will be provided with liberal supplies of medicines, surgical dressings and hospital equipment.

GERMAN ATTEMPTS TO WRECK A TRANSPORT

BOSTON, April 18.—A German agent named Fisher who was allowed on the transport Patricia to look out for German property, attempted to set fire to the vessel as it neared Boston with 2,000 American soldiers. He had been locked in his state room due to his odd actions, and had manipulated electric wire to start a blaze.

TACOMA, April 18.—The Central Labor Council has refused to appoint a representative on the Loan Committee or to help push the sale of the Victory bonds. The conservatives say that the radicals are attempting to boycott the Loan.

May 12th, 1919, at the office of the United States Reclamation Service, Klamath Falls, Oregon, about one mile of canal of about fifty second-foot capacity (locally known as the Ankeny canal), situate in SW 1/4 SW 1/4 Sec. 29, SE 1/4 Sec. 30, NE 1/4 NE 1/4 Sec. 31, and W 1/4 NW 1/4 Sec. 32, all in Township 38 S. Range 9 E. W. M., together with power site situated in lot 8 of Section 32, Township 38 South, Range 9 East, W. M., Klamath County, Oregon, subject to the rights of owners of certain lots and parcels of land in the city of Klamath Falls, Oregon, to take and use therefrom a total of approximately five (5) miner's inches of water for irrigation and domestic purposes. The canal right of way is burdened with an obligation to deliver water to a few certain tracts and will be sold subject to this obligation. SALE OF TIMBER

Sealed proposals in duplicate, each in an envelope marked "Proposal for tribal timber," and directed to the Supervisor in charge, Klamath Indian School, Klamath Agency, Oregon, will be received until 12 o'clock noon, Pacific Coast time, April 30, 1919, for the purchase of the merchantable saw timber on the following described lands: Portions of sections 25 and 26, T. 31 S., R. 7 E., W. M., comprising all tribal timber. The timber is estimated at approximately 3,000,000 feet, all yellow pine. The lowest bid per thousand feet, board measure, log scale, which will be considered for this timber is \$3.35. All timber must be cut, removed and paid for under regulation prescribed by the Commissioner of Indian Affairs before Dec. 31, 1919. With each proposal a certified check amounting to \$500.00 must be submitted. This check should be drawn in favor of the supervisor in charge, Klamath Agency, Oregon. Checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned, and that of the successful bidder will be applied toward the payment on the timber or retained as a forfeit if the bid is accepted, and the bidder fails to enter into contract for the purchase of the timber within thirty days from the date of the acceptance of the proposal. The timber must be paid for in advance of cutting by deposits of not less than \$1,000.00 each. The right of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs to waive technical defects in the advertisement and proposal and to reject any and all bids is reserved.
