**BILLY SUNDAY MAY COME HERE**

**CELEBRATED EVANGELIST MAY BE BROUGHT TO KLAMATH FALLS TO SPEAK IN BEHALF OF LIBERTY LOAN**

That the celebrated "Billy" Sunday will be brought to Klamath Falls as one of the campaign speakers during the coming big Victory Loan drive in Klamath County, if it is found possible for the energetic leaders here to bring him in, was unanimously decided yesterday afternoon at the meeting of the county workers held at the Odd Fellows' hall.

County Chairman A. B. Epperson read a telegram before the assembled workers to the effect that it might be possible to get this renowned speaker, and this possibility will be followed with strenuous effort.

E. N. Strong, leader for Southwestern Oregon, who was in to give

the final instructions to the county workers, gave an inspiring talk which enlisted a fighting spirit in the group of fifty or more workers which had assembled from different parts of the city and county.

He quoted Mr. Piper of the Oregonian, who was one of the committee of American editors who visited the battle front during the war, and who brought back a message from the women. Their one prayer, he said, was that America should put her whole shoulder to the wheel and finish the war and bring back to them their 5,000 daughters who had been carried away by the German officers to a life of shame and disgrace. Mr. Strong emphasized the fact that patriotism is not dead, nor even smouldering, and we can expect the people to take bonds because of their patriotism. We should all be willing to subscribe for our quota as a testimony of thanksgiving that the war was won so quickly, he declares. One year more of war would have meant 500,000 casualties among our boys at the front and several more issues of bonds.

A. M. Collier, city chairman, reported that the city was well organized for the Victory Loan, and called on several of his committeemen to back him up. There is keen rivalry indicated between the committees, and they are all going at it in a business-like way.

Owing to short notice and busy season among the farmers, the county precincts were not able to send in many representatives.

Miss Ida B. Momyer, chairman of the county precincts, reported the

precinct committees as ready for action, and representatives from Merrill, Mallin and Langell Valley pledged their precincts as 100 per cent for the Victory Loan.

Local speakers gave the workers a few "shots in the arm," and they will go out on their work next week bullet proof, and will not accept an answer of no. Every man will be expected to take his quota.

**FACTS ABOUT THE VICTORY LOAN BONDS**

The following pertinent facts in regard to the Victory Loan bonds which will be offered for sale through the United States next Monday morning are of general interest at this time.

The campaign will be conducted from April 21st to May 10th. The quota allotted to Klamath County is \$388,400.

The bonds will begin drawing interest on May 20th, 1919 and are due and payable on a corresponding date in 1923.

Rates of interest are as follows: 4 and 3-4 per cent, exempt from all state and local taxes except estate and inheritance taxes and from normal federal inheritance taxes. Also 3 and 3-4 per cent. Exempt from all federal state and local taxes except Estate and Inheritance taxes. All bonds will be 4 3-4 per cent at 84 whether so specified or not. The two

classes of bonds may be converted from one class to the other at any time. The interest coupons will be payable to the owner on December 15th and June 15th.

The installment payments which is this loan run over a much longer period and are therefore much easier for the buyer are as follows: 10 per cent with application before May 10th, 10 per cent on July 15, 20 per cent on August 12th, 20 per cent on September 9th, 20 per cent on October 7th, 20 per cent on November 11th. Sixty six days are allowed between the first and second payments.

Persons buying a \$100 at 4 and 3-4 per cent interest on the installment plan, will add to their last payment on November 11th, \$1.55 as accrued interest. The first coupon due a month later will be worth \$2.89. Those paying for their bonds in full by July 15th will pay only seventy-eight cents interest.
