DEMOCRACY FOR RUSS FINALLY IS PREDICTED

OMSK, Siberia. (Correspondence of the Associated Press)—Admiral Kolchak, head of the All-Russian government, speaking recently in Ekaterinburg before a conference of members of the Duma, zemstvo and other organizations, reiterated his belief in democracy for Russia, declaring it to be "the only admissible form of future government."

Bolshevism, he said, is destroying the very foundation of authority in the country and means a desperate struggle for a long time.

At present, he pointed out, conditions sometimes force the government to employ means which do not correspond with principles of democracy, but he assured his hearers that such measures were temporary and that steps were being taken to insure universal suffrage, labor and land legislation and to develop organs of self-government.

"The government endeavors to maintain and strengthen friendly relations with the Allies," said the dictator. "Russia was alarmed by the invitation to send her delegates to Prince's Islands to negotiate with Bolsheviki. Now this question is settled. The statesmen of western Europe now see the truth and blame the Bolsheviki, calling them murderers and terrorists, as did Lloyd George."

"The government is inspired with the ideal of restoring the motherland. It is not called upon to settle all fundamental questions. The Russian people is master of its fate. Released from the yoke of Bolshevism it will, through its representatives in a national assembly, express its will in regard to its form of government and its social structure. Then the present government will transfer its power to such an authorized government."

BISHOP PADDOCK HOMEWARD BOUND

PORTLAND, April 25.—The Right Rev. Robert L. Paddock, bishop of the Episcopal diocese of Eastern Oregon has elected to Rev. Dr. Van Maten, archdeacon of the Eastern Oregon diocese, that he will arrive in New York May 1 and will take the first train for his coast. Bishop Paddock has been overseas with the V. M. C. A. for more than a year.

The above news will be welcomed here by a host of friends of this able clergyman, whose popular lectures in Klamath Falls have always drawn large houses.

HUNS BUILD TRUCKS WITH STEEL TIRES

COBLENZ, April 24.—Twenty German army trucks of various types were shipped recently from Coblenz to the War Department in Washington for observation by mechanics of the motor transportation service of the army. The trucks were selected from a lot of 1,250 turned over to the American Army of Occupation by the Germans in accordance with the armistice.

None of the trucks sent to the United States have rubber tires, the Germans being compelled to use various substitutes because of the shortage of rubber goods. The tires on most of the trucks are of steel on a wooden foundation, the wheel and spokes also being of wood.

DEMANDING RIGHT TO WEAR MEN'S CLOTHES.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla., April 25.—The prospect of Florida women securing equal suffrage brought forth a bill which has been introduced in the house regulating the wearing of male attire by members of the gentler sex. It provides that "from and after equal suffrage has been established in the state of Florida, it shall be lawful for females to don and wear the wearing apparel of a man as now worn publicly by him," that is to say, she may wear the coat, vest, trousers, shoes, shirt, collar and necktie as worn by males.

GERMANS SAY THAT CAUSE WAS HOPELESS.

PARIS, April 25.—No one could have won the war for Germany—not even Napoleon—said Maximilian Harden, famous German publicist, in analyzing the causes of Germany's present situation in his newspaper the Zukunft, according to advices from Zurich today.

A prudent policy might have led to a draw, Herr Harden argued but no better result was possible.

The generals and admirals took the lead and were followed by the cabinet like "an obedient little dog," declared Herr Harden, adding, "American intervention, which only the greatest imprudence could bring about, hastened the catastrophe."

RAIL AND WIRE TARIFFS UP TO SUPREME COURT

WASHINGTON, April 25.—Steps looking to early determination of the Government's authority under the joint resolution of congress by which control of the railroads and telephone systems of the country was taken over to fix intrastate rates, has been taken by the supreme court in agreeing to expedite consideration of test cases brought under the resolution. The court fixed May 5 for hearing arguments, and final decisions before the court adjourns in June are considered probable.

Three cases in all will be argued. One is an appeal from South Dakota supreme court decree denying the authority of the postmaster-general to increase telephone toll rates. An appeal from the North Dakota supreme court denies the director-general of railroads has power to increase freight and passenger rates in that state and enjoins the Northern Pacific railroad from carrying out the director-general's orders. The third case is an appeal from Massachusetts upholding the postmaster-general and dismissing proceedings instituted by the state to prevent the New England Telephone and Telegraph company from increasing its rates. Petitions seeking to have the Massachusetts case reviewed have been granted by the court.

Proceedings attacking the government's power in these matters have been instituted in about twenty-five states.
