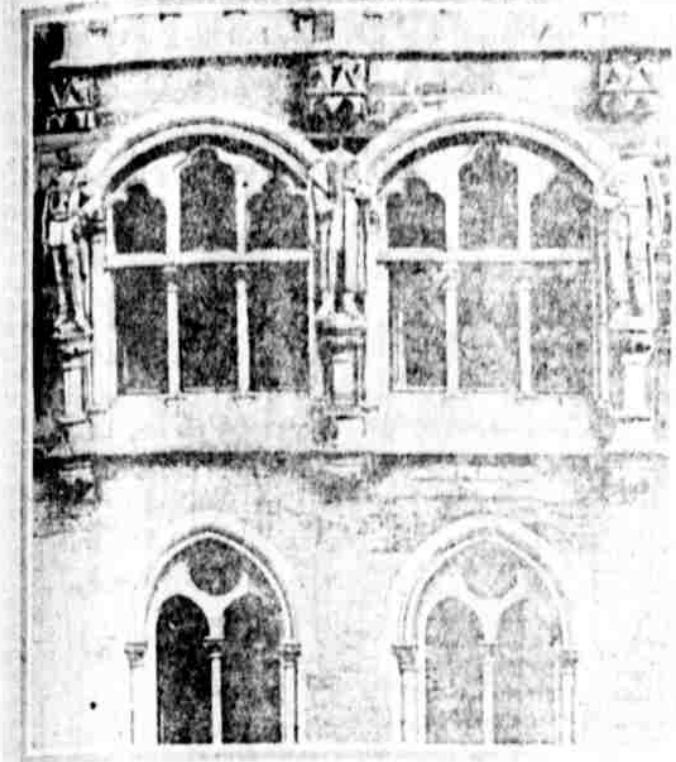


Jubilant Inhabitants of Strausburg Knock Heads Off Statues of Three German Rulers

"Come on you \_\_\_\_\_, do you want to live forever?"
