**M'NARY WANTS  
AIR PATROL OF  
STATE FORESTS**

WASHINGTON, April 26.—Senator McNary has written to Chief Forester Graves, of the department of agriculture, a letter in which he says: "You know that the great forests of America are located in part of Oregon and Washington, in the Cascade and Coast ranges of mountains. I believe that experience will demonstrate that millions of dollars worth of timber can be saved annually by the employment of aircraft as fire exterminators. It is my judgment and I submit it to your consideration for whatever it is worth that there should be at least four points of operation in Oregon, two in the Cascade mountains and two in the Coast range mountains.

"I am anxious to know of your plan of operation, whether the government, at its own expense, will acquire or lease property for flying fields and supply the necessary equipment, or is it your proposal to encourage municipalities or the state to provide essential fields and equipment. I might add, if air navigation is to become feasible to the end that the best results are obtained, the United States provide airframes sufficient in number on the road proposed, to be able to remove all dangers to air navigation which are always present in conveying an airplane to earth. It will be easy to map out a course north and south along the two mountain ranges where aircraft would be operated in order to protect the forests. If this were done it is my sincere judgment that the counties or the states lying in a channel of this course of navigation would provide grounds and equipment essential for use of airplanes.

**BAY RUM GROWS POPULAR.**

CHARLESTON, W. Va., April 26.—The sale of bay rum in West Virginia, except when denatured, is in violation of the state prohibition law, according to notification sent to all druggists by State Tax Commissioner W. S. Hallman.

The commissioner states that he has not been disposed to interfere with the sale of bay rum for legitimate medicinal purposes, but in view of continued complaints that are made regarding the sale of the preparation, he is forced to place it under a ban. Bay rum may be sold, said Mr. Hallman, when it has been denatured so as to make it absolutely impossible as a beverage.

**UTAH WOMEN BUSY.**

SALT LAKE, April 26.—The Utah Women's Liberty Loan committee was credited with a \$250,000 Victory Loan subscription today by the Mormon church whose president announced that the work of Utah women in the war entitled them to the honor of obtaining the subscription.
