MEDFORD SAVES RAILROAD FROM BEING JUNKED

MEDFORD, April 28.—The Pacific & Eastern railroad extending between Medford and Butte Falls, has been saved from being junked, the drive to raise \$30,000 by public subscription in Medford having ended successfully last Wednesday. The day opened with only \$1000 lacking and the committee of citizens in charge of the campaign redoubled its efforts, and at noon it was seen the amount would be subscribed.

When the news became known that the old-time spirit of Medford had again triumphed, there was great rejoicing throughout the city and in Eagle Point, Butte Falls and other centers along the railroad. The news caused a sudden rush of optimism and business activity to replace the despondency of the past few weeks, when it looked as though this valuable railroad asset to Southern Oregon might be lost.

Plans are now being rushed to put the road into operation as soon as possible. With the announcement of success, John Tomlin declared he would at once start construction of his new \$20,000 box factory at Crater Lake junction, and the Big Pines Lumber company will open up logging operations, and the Applegate Lumber company will resume activity as soon as the logs begin to roll.

The resumption of Pacific & Eastern operation means a payroll of \$1000 a day will be established in this city and Butte Falls. Every business in the valley will be stimulated and benefitted.

Medford raised a total of \$30,000 while a similar sum was pledged by the lumber interests in Butte Falls, allowing \$50,000 for the initial payment required and \$10,000 for initial operating expenses. It is confidently believed that with the increased tonnage guaranteed the road will be permanently conducted on a paying basis and this will in turn make Medford's chances of securing a through road to the east and west brighter than ever before.

INTERNEED GERMANS BROUGHT TO TIME.

SYDNEY, April 29.—The six hundred German civilian interned in a concentration camp at Holdsworth, near Sydney, recently killed all the dogs and cats in the compound in an attempt to compel the camp commandant to rescind an order temporarily stopping their supply of food and water. The Germans either ate the Australian pets or pretended to have done so. Anyway, they raised the heads of the animals on pikes.

The conflict arose over the arrest and confinement of two of the Germans for attempting to escape from the compound. The others went on strike to compel the commandant to release the two men and when he cut off their food and water they killed the camp pets. Nine of the ringleaders were arrested and the demonstration ended when half rations were issued.

OLCOTT ASKS STATE TO OBSERVE MAY 4.

SALEM, April 29.—In a statement issued today, Governor Olcott calls attention of the people of Oregon to the designation of Sunday May 4, as "Employment Sunday" through the United States, and the governor suggests that the churches of Oregon should observe the day.

"Employment Sunday," has been set apart by the United States employment service and its co-operating agencies, and effort on part of churches will be to assist in finding work for returning soldiers and sailors.

STOUT ARRESTS TWO FOR FISHING WITHOUT LICENSE

Claude and Percy Haskins were arrested here today by Game Warden Henry Stout for fishing without a license. They were brought before Justice N. J. Chapman charged with this offense and will receive sentence on May 30.

LOAN QUOTA EXCEEDED.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 28.—The State of Oregon outside of Portland exceeded its Victory Loan quota on Saturday night. Portland has now approximately fifty per cent subscribed.

GERMANY COULDN'T FEED HER PRISONERS

BERLIN, April 29.—"There are at present 2,000,000 unemployed men in Germany, 250,000 of them being in Berlin," it is declared by Labor Minister Gustav Adolph Bauer, in an interview. He continued:

"It is true that if the German war prisoners were repatriated now it would seriously complicate the employment situation. The workers already idle cannot be employed until peace raises the blockade on raw materials without which Germany must economically perish."

"But the repatriation of prisoners has its human and sentimental side as well. Wives, mothers and sisters want their men back even if they have to go on starvation diet after they get here."

WILSON ASKED TO AID ARMENIANS.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 28.—The State Department has cabled to President Wilson the memoranda prepared by an Armenian official which states that the delays caused by the Peace Conference are giving the Turks an opportunity to complete the extermination of the Armenian race. American protection from this condition is requested.

NAVY PLANE CREATES NEW FLYING RECORD.

NORFOLK, Va., April 29.—The navy has created a new world's flying record. Seaplane No. 3589, with twin Liberty motors, took the air at 11:42 o'clock Friday morning and remained aloft 20 hours, landing at 7:52 o'clock this morning in Hampton Roads. The course over which the machine flew was from Norfolk to the mouth of the Potomac. The flying boat carried 1000 gallons of gas and had aboard Lieutenant Commander H. N. Grow, Ensign DeLoe Thomas, H. W. Southern and Rutledge Irving.

CHINAMAN HAS A FINE WAR RECORD.

NEW YORK, April 29.—One of the bravest men in the 77th division is Sing Kee, a Chinese, born in San Francisco, according to his comrades. Sing Kee is color sergeant. He arrived here today on the Mount Vernon, wearing the distinguished service cross, "conceded under his coat" for extraordinary valor as a runner during a stubborn battle.

When asked about his adventures, all he would say was, "No speak English."

SHORTAGE OF HELP OVER EAST OREGON

PORTLAND, April 29.—The Farm Help Specialist has just returned from a trip through the eastern Oregon section where he has been investigating labor and crop conditions. While there is a shortage of farm labor in nearly every county in the wheat district there seems to be a tendency on the part of the farmers to plant a full acreage. While more men could be used to advantage and are really needed yet by employing methods learned during the war farming operations will be carried on and crop production held up to normal. Crop conditions are excellent at this time and if prospects continue there will be a bumper wheat crop all over eastern Oregon.

SOUTH POLE FLIGHT HOPE.

LONDON, April 29.—Another antarctic expedition is being planned, according to a statement printed in the newspapers here. John Cope, biologist with the British Antarctic expeditions of 1914-1917, will be leader and expects the expedition to start in June 1920.

He intends to take an airplane for surveying the interior of the continent. He hopes also to make a flight to the south pole.
