

BURLESON MAY SOON BE FIRED FROM POSITION

WASHINGTON, April 29.—The row in the Democratic party over the retention of Postmaster General Burleson in the cabinet is assuming such proportions that President Wilson soon will be compelled to take the matter in hand.

Whether Mr. Burleson shall go or stay will be decided by the president when he returns to Washington, if not earlier. In anticipation of developments the postmaster general has cabled the president a lengthy defense which includes his charges that disgruntled periodical publishers are behind the attacks upon him.

There will be an investigation of postal, wire and cable services initiated as soon as the new congress meets. Democratic members are no less in favor of such investigation than are the Republicans, who will be in control.

In addition, the Democrats are preparing to line up with the Republicans in support of legislation restoring the telegraph and telephone and cable lines to their owners. Representative Aswell, of Louisiana, a Democrat, who introduced the bill authorizing the government to take over the wire systems, said that he would apologize to the house for fathering legislation which has brought about the situation resulting from Burleson's management of the lines.

It also reported that Democratic national committees intended to bring the case of Burleson before the national committee at its forthcoming session in Chicago. Several committees are said to have warned Chairman Cummings already that unless the party drops the political plot of the administration defeat in the presidential election next year will be a certainty. In the absence of Chairman Cummings, William J. Cochran, at Democratic national committee headquarters, denied that there is any basis for such reports.

GERMANS HAVE PLAN TO SUBMIT TO ALLIES.

BERLIN, April 29.—Restriction of armaments and the administration of all colonies by an international colonial department are two of the features of the German draft of a "league of nations" which has been prepared for submission to entente envoys at Versailles. It stipulates that all nations that become members shall have equal rights, and that secret agreements shall be abolished. Existing treaties are to be annulled. The constitution of the proposed society provides that state congresses shall meet annually at the seat of a world parliament, which shall be permanent.

Provision is made for an international board of arbitration. No country shall declare war unless attacked and "freedom of the seas shall be made secure."
