

DANCING POPULAR IN LONDON.

LONDON, April 30.—Every day sees the opening of a new dancing room in London. "There is not a public hall to rent in the city or a private hall either," said an old ballroom master who is now a ballroom dance manager. "House agents, particularly in Kensington, have entered the spirit of the search, and are canvassing the owners and tenants of private houses who may have big rooms to let. A private house has an advantage over a public hall as it can keep open until the next day if it likes, while a public hall must close at midnight."

"Anyone teaches dancing now. Girls who have just learned set up as teachers in dance halls, and working four or eight together, in one hall, earn from \$20 to \$30 a week each."
