GOVERNMENT TO ROUND UP ALL DESERTERS NOW

WASHINGTON, May 1.—The government is about to start a great round-up of draft deserters, who are to be tried and punished as fast as apprehended.

Final separation of the sheep from the goats among all those delinquents who, having failed to report at camps in answer to their calls under the draft, have been automatically classified as deserters, will be completed by the provost marshal general's office within the next three weeks, and the result reported to the adjutant general.

So careful have been the officers in charge to avoid injustice, that after painstaking review of each case the delinquents have been classified under 15 different headings. In the cases of all men falling within 14 of these classes, the report will be accompanied by a recommendation that the charge of desertion is canceled. The 15th will be the "real" list of deserters, the men whose names appear upon it being those for whom no reason or excuse has been presented or discovered.

Included in the 14 classes are men who, after the first registration, in June and before December 15, 1917, enlisted in any branch of the United States, "branch unknown"; those who enlisted in any allied army; men technically inducted thru error; men who reported and were sent to camp after "desertion"; who were inducted and later found to be physically disqualified and discharged by camp commanders; men who were in process of induction in the service at the time the armistice was signed and men who, after having been reported as deserters had presented themselves to their local boards and whose cases had not been completed when the armistice was signed, alien enemies, and men who have died since the charge was entered against their names.

STATE TO HELP EMPLOYMENT WORK

SALEM, May 1.—How the state can build up an employment service to conform to a national employment system outlined in a recent conference at Washington without calling a special session of the legislature to appropriate the necessary money is a problem that now confronts the executive office and the state department of labor.

State Labor Commissioner, C. H. Green has received from W. H. Fitzgerald, deputy state commissioner who attended the Washington conference, a telegram announcing that a national program has been arranged which contemplates a service to be operated by the states, the government to give financial assistance only to the extent of matching appropriations by the state. It does not lie within the province of the state emergency board to make the needed appropriation if the state should determine to adopt the program as outlined at Washington. The government will standardize the service in each state.

The Washington conference was a meeting of federal and state labor officials. Mr. Fitzgerald will today attend an industrial service conference at Milwaukee.
