# FISH AND GAME BODY ACCUSED

SERIOUS CHARGES ARE MADE AGAINST CERTAIN MEMBERS OF OREGON BOARD, GAME WARDEN INVOLVED

PORTLAND, May 3.—The attorney Charles Olin, a Finn fisherman have filed a complaint in the Federal court, alleging that several members of the State Fish and Game Commission have conspired and procured legislation from the last legislature, confiscating valuable fishing rights on the Columbia River belonging to Olin, in order that Kitamiller might appropriate them.

Game Warden Shoemaker and Superintendent of Hatcheries Clenton are also alleged to be in the conspiracy.

The legislation prohibited the issuance of a "set net" license to persons not citizens of the United States.

## "MY SOLDIER GIRL" A MILITARY SPECTACLE

A gorgeous musical spectacle, with military atmosphere, entitled "My Soldier Girl," will be the attraction at the Houston Opera House, two nights, starting tomorrow night and Monday night. Dixie suggests the girls offer their services to Uncle Sam in the aviation department—they are accepted—and in the second act we find nearly the entire company at Col. Stone's home at Miami, preparing a grand entertainment for officers from Washington. Much to their surprise, the instructors prove to be Tom Lawson and Teddy Carter, former members of the musical show, who have attained commissions as aviators and are assigned the Florida post. The act closes with a novel military drill—the girls are dressed in snappy aviation costumes—an aerial flight takes place as the curtain descends on this interesting entertainment. The last act is a tableaux "Somewhere in France,"—a novel scenic effect of a desolate battlefield, dissolving into the Goddess of Liberty and closing this impressive scene with "The Star Spangled Banner." An excellent cast, including Billy Moore, Mac Marvin, James Barber, Charles George and many others, also including a wonderfully clever chorus, present this novel play.
