THE ROOSEVELT HIGHWAY.

One thing the voters of Klamath county should not forget on June 3rd and that is to vote for the Roosevelt highway. There are two reasons for this. First, it should be built because it develops that section of Oregon, and what helps one part of the state helps all of it. Second, because we will get federal money to build it, and if there is any way on earth that we can get any money out of those penny-pinchers in Washington, let us do it. They have stolen millions from Oregon and squandered it on pet projects in other states. Now let us put it up to them to hand some of it back on a 50-50 basis even though it goes hard to compromise with the thievery of the past.

There is no question but Klamath county will go almost solidly for this highway. But don't forget it on the theory that there will be enough votes anyway. There is a big vote in this state that still clings to the idea that we don't need good roads, and you can bet the las cent you have that every one of them will be on hand to vote against it. Just kill that vote by voting for it, and become part of the great movement that is lifting old Oregon out of the mud.

TWO MEASURES THAT MUST PASS

Two sections of Oregon that are widely separated by a great distance geographically on account of two barrier mountain ranges are figuratively joining hands for a united drive on the ballot boxes at the special state election in June. That great stretch of empire known as Eastern Oregon is enthusiastically working to give the coast counties of Oregon the Roosevelt Highway; the seven great coast counties comprising one-seventh of the area of the state are just as enthusiastically working to develop the irrigation projects of the East Oregonians.

An apt illustration of the friendly spirit that is animating the coast counties is a rally held at Gardiner on the Umpqua river recently when settlers came by the hundreds to boost for the Roosevelt highway bond issue. Some of those in attendance came from points miles distant in boats. More than a thousand gathered at Gardiner to hear President S. C. Pier of the Roosevelt highway association explain the wonderful possibilities that will be opened up by what he declared will be the greatest scenic boulevard in the world.

The assemblage not only endorsed the highway project, but it went on record with a unanimous resolution favoring the passage of the Gallagher bill whereby the state is given authority to lend its credit to irrigation projects approved by a special commission consisting of the state superintendent of banks, the state engineer and the attorney general.

Letters and telegrams endorsing the Gallagher bill are pouring into the headquarters of the Roosevelt highway association at the Imperial Hotel, Portland, from the chambers of commerce and other public spirited organizations all over the coast. Similar endorsements for the coast highway are reaching the association by the score from the irrigation belts of eastern, southern and central Oregon.

The two bills are of kindred importance. The Roosevelt highway if built will bring millions of tourists to Oregon. These tourists will not only view the unparalleled scenery offered by the highway, but they will seek opportunities to invest their money and make their homes in Oregon. The great stretches of land in the irrigation sections offer the best kind of chance for investments. The people of Eastern Oregon and other

BELGIUM READY TO SIGN TREATY

PRINTED DRAFT TO BE PRESENTED TO THE GERMANS ON THURSDAY. LEAGUE ORGANIZATION IS NOW PERFECTED

Dateless Dispatch by Associated Press.—Belgium will sign the peace treaty despite the protest filed at Brussels that the financial, economical territorial aspect of the pact is unsatisfactory.

A meeting of the Crown Council was held at Brussels Sunday and it was decided to sign the treaty.

A printed draft of the treaty is to be printed today and will probably be presented to the Germans on Thursday. It is intimated that some arrangements for Italy to participate at the Versailles ceremony will be reached.

The Austrian delegation to the conference is reported to have met at Vienna and is expected to arrive in Paris soon after the Germans have received their treaty.

The decision to summon the Austrians is expected to have some influence on the return of the Italians and also the fact that Italy would be without voice in the disposition of Germany's colonies may have some weight in this matter.

The organization of the League of Nations has now been perfected. The Finnish troops which occupied Petrograd are Red Guards.

The Soviet Government of Hungary is in indignation at the seizure of the Hungarian legation at Vienna by counter revolutionary forces and demands that German Austria take immediate action to arrest those involved. Meanwhile Budapest is in a panic over the menace to the city from the approach of the Czech, Serbian and Rumanian troops.
